 FLIP Plan offers mortgage creativity|  | and master suite, sells for $\$ 72,250$ Traditional mortgage wisdom would ask for an income large enough for the payment-to-income ratio to be 25 percent. A large down payment, of course, would mean that a smaller monthly income would be sufficient. <br> FLIP allows most of that down payment to go into an earmarked savings account. The principal and interest from the account are used to help pay the mortgage during the first five years, when presumably income is rising. By the start of the sixth year, when the savings account is depleted, the income has risen sufficiently so that the payment -to- income ratio is only 25 percent. For the rest of the term of the mortgage, the monthly payment remains constant. <br> A closer look at that particular house shows that a buyer with an income of $\$ 27,000$ could use a FLIP mortgage to good advantage. With a down paymerit of $\$ 10,800$, the earmarked savings account would be $\$ 6,230.88$. Then the monthly payment in the first year of principal and interest would be only \$441.53. (It must be remembered that mortgage insurance, taxes, and fire and extended coverage insurance are re quired; since the payments on those items are so variable, they have not been included here.) In the second year, the monthly | payment rises to \$474.23, but income has presumably risen also. For the third year, the figure is $\$ 508.82$ each month. <br> In the fourth year of the FLIP program, the monthly mortgage payment would be $\$ 545.43$. Fifth year, \$584.16. And, finally, in the sixth and all succeeding years, $\$ 625.15$. <br> Hamill points out that this is not everybody's mortgage. "Ability to earn goes up at approximately six percent per year. This is a patented program on a computer which figures out the curve and shows what an individual will be able to pay at the start of the sixth year. The largest group of those who qualify for this program also qualify for conventional mortgages but are terrified of the large monthly payment. Many of them choose standard financing after all, but FLIP offers them an option. The smaller group of those who qualify for this program are slightly short for a conventional mortgage for the home they need. For them, the FLIP program is ideal, because it allows them to use a savings account's income to help pay their mortgage each month." <br> Mortgage defaults are usually in the first two and a half years, Hamilton and Hamill are agreed. "If present trends continue," Hamill says, "this will be a valuable device to place people in homes.' <br> Doug Fields of South King Realty, sales agent for United Homes, points out that the public is better educated now about real estate. Old or new homes are eligible, but only United Homes is participating to any substantial degree among the builders.
