\$50 Million asked for Ag bond issue

A $\$ 50$ million bond issue to
finance the peservation of farm finance the peservation of farm
lands in King County has been recommended for the Sept. 18 ballot by the Farmlands Study
Committee appointed by the Committee appointed by the
county executive after a similar bond issue failed in the general election last November
The money would be used, if the county council votes to put the
measure on the ballot and it is successful, to acquire the development rights of between
12,000 and 15,000 acres of farm land in the county during a six year period.
The annual cost to the taxpayers over the thirty year life of payers over the thirty year life of
the bonds wuld be about $\$ 9$ on a home assessed at $\$ 50,000$.
Among the first priority lands is a parcel east of Star Lake in the Lake Fenwick area. It is about one mile wide and slightly more
than two miles long. Most of the rest of the recommended properties lie in the Green, Snoqualmie ties lie in the Green, Snoqualmie
and Sammamish River vallies
and the Enumclaw Plateau.

The purchase program, if approved by the voters, would be on stressed. The development rights to the land would be bought by the county and, though the land land could never be used for anything but agriculture in the
future without an approving vote future without an approving vo of the people of King County. Members of the committee told
the council Monday the effort is the council Monday the effort is
needed because farmland is rapidly disappearing in the county. In the Green River Valley alone, more than 20,000 acres of agriculture land in the past 25 years.
One of the reasons the land is being sold to developers, according to a committee report, is
that farming is not profitable and "no rational person will risk his money to purchase a business will operate at a los.
The purchase of development rights would be the difference between profit and loss for dairy

During the ancient days, men inging caravans of rich, pungent inging caravans of rich, pungent
and aromatic spices to the rich man's dinner table. Today every food store stocks shelves of these
food enhancers and all cooks have easy access to their own kitchen spice racks.
Generations before us relied on spices for survival, not only were
they used religious ceremonies, medicines and in courtship.

Spices have a loose definition and are often intermingled with herbs, said Dee Dovey, manager of the Specialty Spice Shop at
SeaTac Mall.

But loosely defined, spices
come from the tropics and are derived from dried fruits, barks, derived from dried fruts,
flower buds, pods, berries, flower stigmas and whole plants.
No one really knows when
spices were first used in spices were first used in Chinese herbal dated 2700 B.C. was uncovered and mentioned the use of cinnamon. Visitors to the Isle of Rhodes in 2800 B.C.
feasted on such Grecian feasted on such Grecian
specialties as gingerbread and nougats.
Centuries before Christ, the desert had a spice cartel. They gained lavish profits from taxes on the spice caravans passing
through their kingdomes.

Frequently spices are mention-
ed in the Old Testament Bible; in
Genesis $43: 11$, the recipe reads,
"a litte honey, spices, myrrh,
nuts and almonds." nuts and almonds. New worlds were discovere
during the pursuit for Spain and Portugal were the leaders in transporting sices, until the 1600's when the English
captured the monopoly away captured the monopoly away
from the Dutch. Then they became the dominate merchants in the East India spice trade. Pepper, the mate to salt, was
one of the most valued spices. Alaris, King of the Goths, in 410 A.D. held Rome in ransom for the sum of 3,000 pounds of pepper
The seasoning is a dried berry
of a vine that once grew wild in the northern region of Sumatra; now it is also cultivated in Brazil,
Thailand, Malaysia and Ceylon. Black pepper is the berries picked just before becoming fully ripe. White pepper is made by removing the outer coating and
letting the berry ripen. Then it is ground into powder.
The cinnamon, found in today's store, is actually cassia, a close
second to the sweet spice. The onsecond to the sweet spice. The onthe tree they come from.
The cinnamon or cassia bark is gathered after the May and
November rains in the Far East. The spice can be used in cakes, breads, fruit dishes, puddings,
pork, ham, and stews. The cin-
namon sticks add flavoring to hot spiced drinks.
Both mace from the same tree, Ms. Dovey said. Mace is the sun-dried aril, while nutmeg comes from the pit
