## At local truck stop: Truckers close pumps, pledge national strike

Striking independent truckers blocked the diesel fuel pumps at Evergreen Truck Stop Monday afternoon in a move that they said was one of many marking the beginning of a nationwide shutdown.

The blockade, which Truck Village Owner Martin A. Finn said was expected to last five or six hours, began a little after 1:30 p.m. when four independent drivers pulled their big rigs across the service station's truck fueling and servicing lanes.

Truck Village provides fuel and service for drivers who stop at or operate out of the Evergreen Truck Stop, on South 348th Street just west of Interstate 5.

Finn said he sympathizes with the truckers and said that he would not object to the blockade as long as it does not jeopardize his business.

"They don't want to break us," Finn said of the truckers. "When they came in here they were perfect gentlemen."

He said the drivers had told him that spot blockades would be set up to last five or six hours at randomly-chosen truck stops throughout the state and nation. Most of the blockading activities, he said, will be confined to the Monday-through-Friday work week.

"MANY TRUCK stops voluntarily closed their pumps for an hour on Friday," said Finn.

He said that King County Police officers and Washington State Patrol personnel are keeping a close eye on the situation but will not intervene unless violence is threatened or breaks out.

My main fear," Finn said Monday, "is a conflict between a guy who wants to roll and a guy who wants to blockade. This is the sort of thing that happened in '73, driver versus driver."

David Kissinger, of Bangor, Wisc., one of the drivers who barricaded the Truck Village pumps on Monday, said the idea is to show the independent truckers who are still operating that their fellows mean business by the strike.

The strikers' intention, he said, is to force the federal government to hike freight rates.

Kissinger said that the increased cost of diesel fuel has cut truckers' earnings to the point that many are actually losing money and others are making so little they might as well be unemployed.

"I paid taxes on \$2,000 last year," he said.

**TRUCKERS BUY their own**

rigs at a total investment of \$80,000 to \$100,000, Kissinger said. They then lease the equipment to freight companies, with the owner-operators hauling for the companies and paying all the operating expenses.

"The companies make their money off the top," he said, "so the fuel costs don't hurt them."

Freight rates were raised by the federal Interstate Commerce Commission two weeks ago, said Kissinger, but the increase was only 7 percent, and only about 75 percent of that eventually reached the drivers' pockets.

In order to make up for the way that fuel prices have soared since January, when diesel was decontrolled by the Carter Administration, the rates would have to go up by another 30 percent, he said.

"Most people don't realize that diesel prices have been decontrolled since the first of the year," said Gary Wallen, of Clearview, Wash., another of the drivers who were participating in the blockade.

"Since then," he said, "the oil companies have jacked the prices up by nearly 50 percent."

**DRIVERS HAVE** been protesting for several weeks against the high cost of fuel, the 55-miles-per-hour speed limit and the tangle of state and federal bureaucratic regulations under which they operate.

But their protest gained a new impetus Monday when Mike Parkhurst, the editor of "Overdrive," called for a national walkout by the independents. "Overdrive" is a truckers' journal.

Wallen, Kissinger and Ken Taylor, of Alts Loma, Calif., said that the truckers don't want complete deregulation. "But we want the regulations from state to state to be consistent, and they're not," said Taylor, another of the blockaders.

The truckers dislike the 55 miles-per-hour speed limit because, they claim, it requires trucks to operate at speeds at which they consume more fuel. The big rigs get about four miles

to a gallon and sometimes less.

They believe that by striking they will create food shortages and other problems which will force the government to take action.

"YOUR AVERAGE housewife doesn't realize it, but most of the food she buys at the supermarket gets there by truck," said Wallen.

"I think you'll start noticing a shortage within the next three or four days," he said. "We don't want to hurt anybody, but we're hurting, and we don't have any other choice."

Wallen said that everybody in the trucking business has known for several days that a strike was in the wind.

"If you've still got guys out on the road you have to put it in their minds that we're serious. That's why the truck stop blockades," he said.

"There's already been some shooting back east. We don't want anything like that to happen out here...but that owner-operator who's sitting home getting ready to load up and get on the road had better think twice."

The drivers also said that President Jimmy Carter's policies almost seem to have been designed to create problems for the trucking industry and an eventual confrontation between independent truckers and the government.

## County waffles on its debts to sewer

What can Lakehaven Sewer District do when King County, the

body that rules it, refuses to pay that district its just debts? Take 'em court, says district

attorney John Bocek. And it might just come down to that.

According to Bocek, King County owes the sewer district more than \$8,000 in an assessment on 14 acres of greenbelt it owns just below Twin Lakes. The area received sewers in 1968 and when it was divided in 1971, those 14 acres were deeded to the county with the assessment.

At that time, the assessment exceeded only a little more than \$4,000. But the county's neglect in paying has tagged on the additional \$4,000 in penalties and interest to the bill, making the total due more than \$8,000.

When Bocek called on the county for the payment last month, the county replied that the money had not been budgeted and that it can afford only half the bill, or the original assessment.

**THE SEWER DISTRICT** commissioners last week gave that proposal a flat rejection. "It's not fair to the other people in the district," Commissioner Byron Betts said. "Would we do that for a private individual?"

The commissioners agreed that the county's lack of budgeting is not a valid excuse, just as it is not an acceptable reason for a private customer to refuse to make a full payment of an assessment.

But the county says it's more than just an unwillingness to pay. According to Chris Loutsis, manager of the county real property division, the land should not

be assessed on a par with surrounding residential plots because it is designated as a greenbelt and cannot be built upon.

Loutsis said the county currently is dealing with several similar situations and, although not sure in this case, the land may not be receiving proper sewer service. "We'll have to check and see," he said.

Loutsis said there are other instances wherein districts waived the assessments for the county when circumstances are in question. Bocek, however, said that he knows of no law that indicates the district can accept anything less than the full payment for the assessment.

**AND, WHETHER** budgeted or not, Loutsis said the county has the money to pay the full \$8,000. "We'll have to wait and see what's said and what the reasoning is. We may end up paying it all," he said.

The alternative is to sell the land, but both Bocek and Loutsis were doubtful whether that would be profitable. Since the acreage is greenbelt, no building is allowed, making the land undesirable to developers. "There's a question if the county could even get \$4,000 for a piece of greenbelt," Bocek said.

Regardless of selling possibilities or the county's budget, Bocek said the district plans to collect. And if it takes too long, the next step is taking the issue to court, he said.

Poor taste panderers are after us again

The panderers of poor taste are after us again, this time in the form of the Pentagram Corp., owners of the Space Needle.

Pentagram is determined to build a new restaurant at the 100 foot level of the Needle and last week was successful in getting a Seattle City Council denial of the project reversed in Superior Court.

Judge Francis E. Holman said that the Space Needle is too young to qualify as a landmark under present ordinances and that "being a symbol of Seattle" is not sufficient to deny a building permit.

Our initial reaction was that Judge Holman should be lashed to a telephone pole and made to look at the desecration he approved for the next 20 years.

Unfortunately Judge Holman's decision was probably legally correct and he should not be held to blame for legislative inabilities to dictate aesthetics.

No, the fault here is with

Pentagram Corp. whose sense of taste and beauty obviously ends at the teller's cage at the bank. Given the choice between good taste and good dividends the dividends usually prevail.

We usually don't question the right of a property owner to develop his property to the highest and best use under existing zoning and other building controls. Nor is that our intention here. All we can do is appeal to the civic pride of a corporation which has been the beneficiary of fair treatment over the years by the Seattle citizenry.

Regardless of the law or what Judge Holman says, the Space Needle is a landmark and is a symbol of Seattle, King County and the Puget Sound area. If the architecture is altered, uglified or destroyed it no longer is a symbol. And Pentagram should remember it's the symbolization that's made the Needle a success. Pentagram could be not only destroying a landmark but a profitable business at the same time.

Tripp best bet for Betts' sewer post

While Byron Betts' announcement of his intent to resign from the Lakehaven Sewer District Board of Commissioners may be tardy, he nonetheless should be commended for his service to the board throughout the past eight years.

Betts, lauded by fellow commissioners, district employees and customers alike, has helped steer the board through nearly a decade of its most substantial growth. Sometimes cynical, sometimes outspoken, Betts always appeared to have the concern of the public at heart.

That concern also is reflected in Betts' search for a commissioner that would respect the needs of the district as he did. With his resignation, spurred by the question of the legality of his position due to a change in residency, Betts recommends that Leonard Tripp take his place.

Tripp, currently a Water District 124 commissioner and resident of Federal Way for eight years, has proven to

be a discerning, resourceful commissioner in his dealing with the water district throughout the past two years. His experience with that board and his contact with the sewer district, housed in the same building, should lend him an advantage in assuming Betts' responsibilities as a commissioner.

Tripp has shown some interest in filling the vacancy, but is noncommittal. He sees his double role on water and sewer districts as advancing toward merger of the two districts, a goal he has rallied behind since his election to the water district board. He also believes he maintains the best interest of the community, barring others who may seek personal gain from such a position.

In a district that appears to be recently rocked by unrest, only a man as capable as Tripp may be able to help strike a balance in the Lakehaven operation. Tripp is the prime choice for the commissioner position.

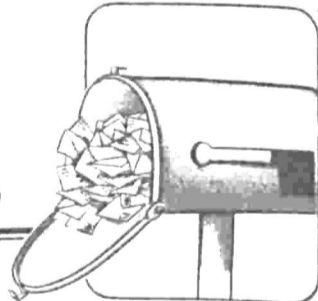
Farrah obviously was the mother.

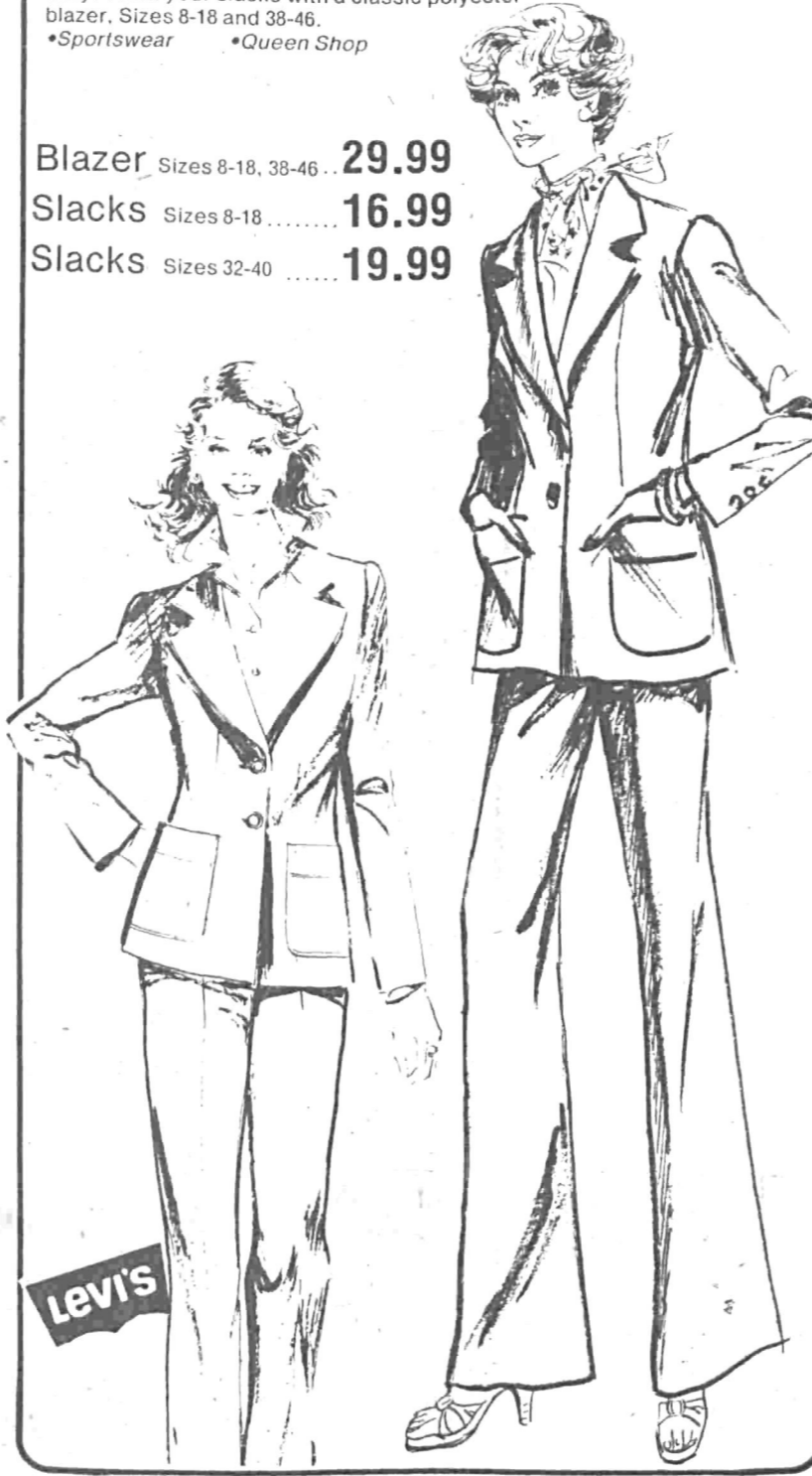

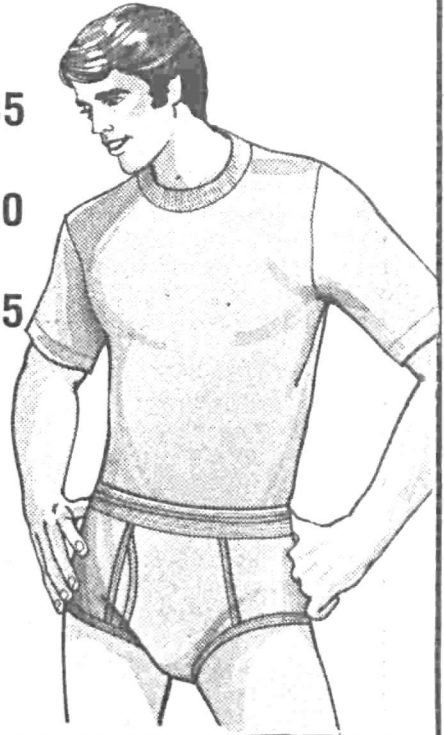

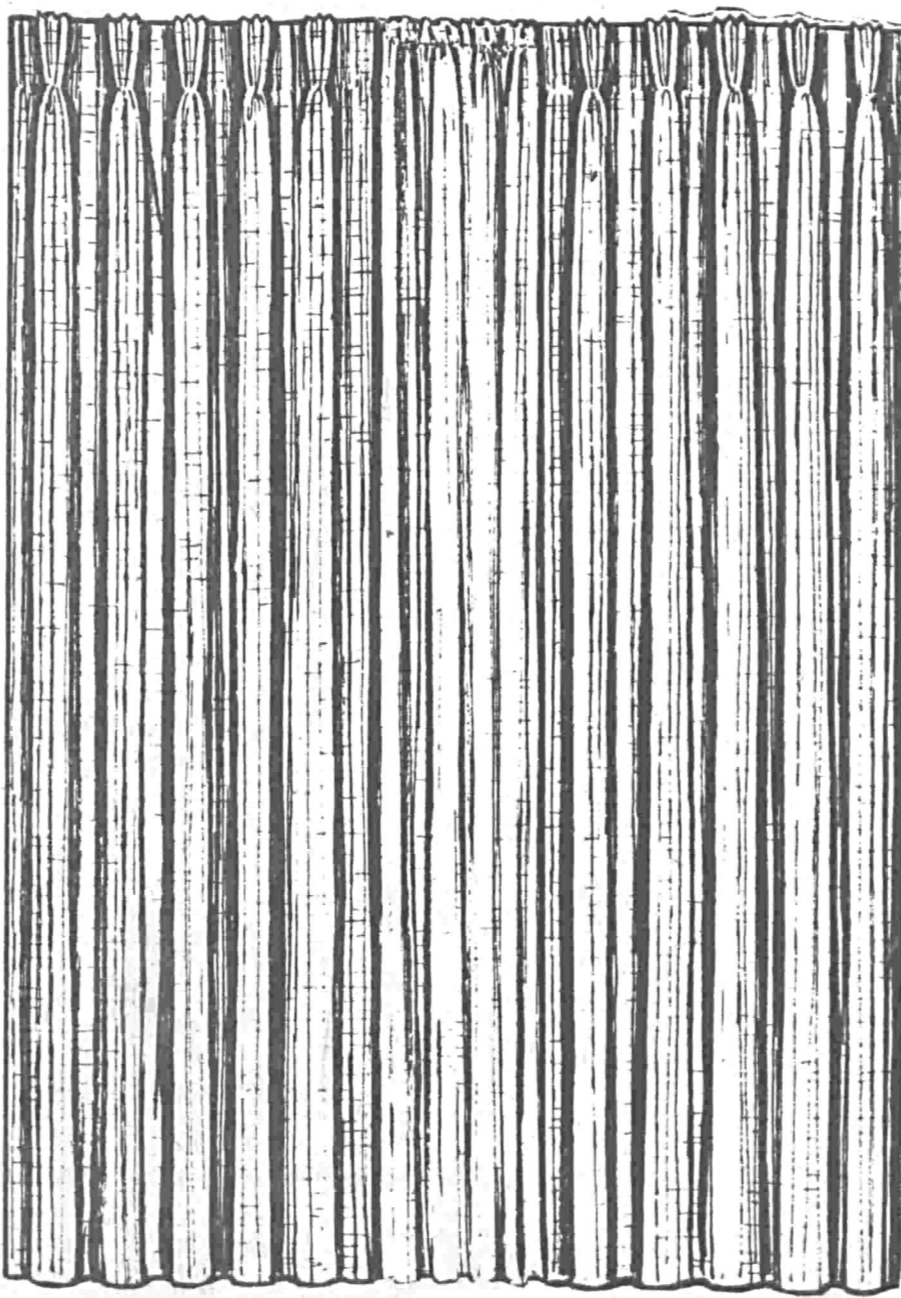

# County rules out marina use

The Redondo Marina building has to go. That's the consequence of the most recent ruling by King County's Building and Land Development (BALD) division, which has resolved that boat storage, a former primary use of the marina building, does not comply with the county's shoreline regulations. Despite recommendations by the Redondo Marina committee that the building be razed anyway, the possibility remained

that the King County Council could opt to retain the structure, using it for boat storage and launching. With the BALD decision, however, that possibility no longer exists. The twist came when BALD altered an earlier position that approved retention of the building if desired by the county. In its new ruling, the department said that boat storage is not shoreline dependent, and therefore would be a violation of

the county's Shoreline Management Act. That act has been initiated by the county since the marina was last used in the late 1960's. In a letter to County Executive John Spellman, King County Architecture division manager Dick Gemperle noted that "this (decision) virtually eliminates any practical use of the building. We have little choice but to remove it." MEANWHILE, THE county is continuing its thrust toward installation of a ramp boat launch, the use recommended by the citizen advisory committee. Since requests for grants were due into the Inter-Agency Committee (IAC) the first of the month for 1980 funding, the county submitted a request for those

funds on the assumption that the county council will approve the recommended plans. According to project manager Bud Parker, the proposed boat ramp use will cost \$1,145,910. The county is asking the state to fund 75 percent of that, with the county matching the remaining 25 percent. This amount does not include a breakwater or a fishing pier, two facilities that have been considered but not decided upon. The chances for the state funding, Parker said, are good. "We should be high priority because we're a waterfront project and because we're going for boat tax money," he said, adding that only water-related projects have access to the boat tax. A decision on the funding is expected in November.

# Motorists ignore rape victim's plea

A 23-year-old woman who had just escaped from a rapist was ignored by several passing motorists as she shouted and waved for help on First Avenue South Friday night, King County Police and detectives said Monday. The woman, who had jumped out of the rapist's car and fled naked to the roadway, was finally picked up by a 28-year-old Federal Way business executive, who took her to his home and called police.

Detectives are looking for a heavy-set man said to be in his late 20s in connection with the incident, which occurred at about 10 p.m. in a wooded area near the intersection of First Avenue South and South 344th Street. Police said the suspect offered to give the woman a ride to her home in Seattle and instead drove to the woods and ordered her to perform various sex acts. The woman works in Federal Way, and it was at her job that she met the suspect, police said.

# Residents speak out on growth in Highline

Highline area residents met in a lively session Monday night to present the county with alternatives to "mounting machine guns at the border to keep the people away" as the county plans for growth in the coming decade.  
The growth management workshop at the Highline Educational Resources Center spawned questions about the future of the area and how and why the county government has failed the area in the past.  
Margaret Ceis, who chaired the meeting, said in preliminary remarks that the county is not "talking no growth...but, if we are to protect what we have, we have to plan."  
Familiar faces from the days of Highline and Sea-Tac Com-

munities Plans dotted the room along with a healthy sprinkling of local elected officials as the "wish book" future of Highline was once again outlined for the county.  
Some of the greatest concerns voiced were the inter-relationship of various local governments and the result for the Highline community. Answering a question from Dee Pedersen of Normandy Park, county growth management Manager Susan Allen acknowledged other governments have been "problems all" for the county and said "we're trying to make sure we hold them accountable and make them aware of our policies. We can't promise miracles."  
One reason for the 11 growth workshops around the county, Allen said, is that "we recognize the fact there are a lot of options

in how we'll grow. We expect a quarter of a million people in the next 10 years in the county" and must decide "how best to accommodate them."  
Highline, an area with a community plan not yet two years old, is being asked to help incorporate the needs of its future with the inevitable growth for the area into the proposed new comprehensive plan, an update of the 1964 document.  
The community plan will not be supplanted by the comprehensive plan but the two documents will be "consistent with each other," Allen said. She said the process of amending community plans, including the Sea-Tac Plan, has been "an area of particularly

rough debates" recently.  
The updated plan will be used "more than past plans" she said. But she told the gathering of about 35 persons the "commitment of elected officials" is not predictable so the plan could be changed. "It can change with the body of elected officials," Allen said. The updated plan will govern land use, not community representation, Allen responded to a question posed by Dottie Harper.  
In the brainstorming session of the workshop, sub-groups "voted" on the items they believed most important to the area. Zoning code enforcement drew the most votes as the item that requires the most county attention.

Incorporation for Burien was highly favored by one group while urban renewal, improved transportation and more sidewalks were also heavily supported within the groups. Urban renewal, drainage, high-rise retirement homes and transportation scored high on the list of priorities.  
The Port of Seattle drew strong criticism from many of those present. One group said the county should oversee Port development and operations and several persons said the airport and marine terminal authority should work to "be a better neighbor."  
And elected officials "should have I.Q. tests," according to one table.

## Historic buttons to be displayed

Political campaign buttons will be featured along with sports, entertainment, social causes, transportation and advertising.

Examples of buttons at the show will be the picture of presidential candidates and a governor of Washington, Teddy Roosevelt and Albert Mead from 1904.  
Buttons advocating a major league Seattle baseball team, "Seattle Majors" advertised the beginnings of the 1969 Seattle Pilots.  
Some buyers at the show will offer as much as \$2,000 for a 1920 political button in excellent condition with pictures on it of both James Cox and Franklin Roosevelt. Full color turn-of-the-century advertising buttons may be sold for \$2 each. Owners with a 1909 Alaska-Yukon Pacific Exposition pin hidden in a drawer may sell it to the show's collectors for \$4.

# FW Rec program keeps boredom blues away

This summer, Federal Way Recreation, part of the King County Parks Department has scheduled a summer full of activities designed to interest all ages.

Beginning at various times in June, there is the dancercise, that women have found enjoyable throughout the winter, weight control, children's ballet and tap and tennis, plus an all-new children's summer craft program.

There will be new instructors, some of whom have taught part of the last session.

Holly Coates, who has a master's degree in social work from the University of Washington has taken over the dancercise classes. She has also added weight control classes, to be taken in conjunction with a beginning or advanced dancercise classes for those who need to take off pounds as well as inches.

The weight control class will center around individual lifestyles. "People need to be aware of their eating patterns and habits in order to change," said the perky Seattleite who worked for a year-and-a-half with food habit management with Group Health. They will be expected to monitor what and when they eat.

"Usually the only reason somebody is willing to do it is because nothing else has worked," she joked. "We're not asking you to go on a diet, just to change your life."

However, the effects of the combination of exercise and good eating habits can be dramatic, she said. There's almost always an improvement in mental as well as physical health, she added. Weight loss will be limited to one to two pounds a week with a realistic food plan, designed to keep pounds off.

Beginning and advanced dancercise

classes will be offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays at various hours at the Boy's and Girl's Club and at Sacajawea Junior High School. Cost is \$14 for weekly sessions and \$25 for twice-weekly sessions for the seven-week course.

The weight control sessions will be held on Tuesday or Thursday from 12:45-1:45 p.m. at Sacajawea. Cost is \$12.

**INSTRUCTOR** CHERI BAUER, will teach the children's ballet and tap lessons scheduled from June 25 through Aug. 1. Classes held at Nautilus and Twin Lakes Elementary will be aimed at beginning and advanced ballet for children four through seven and eight through 12. Cost is \$8.

Various classes are set for Monday and Wednesday mornings, at 45-minute intervals from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. Advanced ballet classes will be held at each school for \$12. Advance class registrations require teacher approval.

For both of the ballet and tap advanced classes, there will be some emphasis on dance and music appreciation, said Ms. Bauer. "It's not going to be strictly exercise, but information too," she said. "We've got a lot of new music and new ideas for the summer sessions and we're ready to go."

The children's "Summer Fun for Kids" program will include a variety of classes including preschool activities, creative drama, arts and crafts and outdoor games.

Classes will be held for one-week sessions, Monday through Friday, at various elementary schools. Participants may register for as many sessions as they'd like at any of the listed schools. Cost is \$8 per class. Family rates are \$15 for two children and \$20 for three.

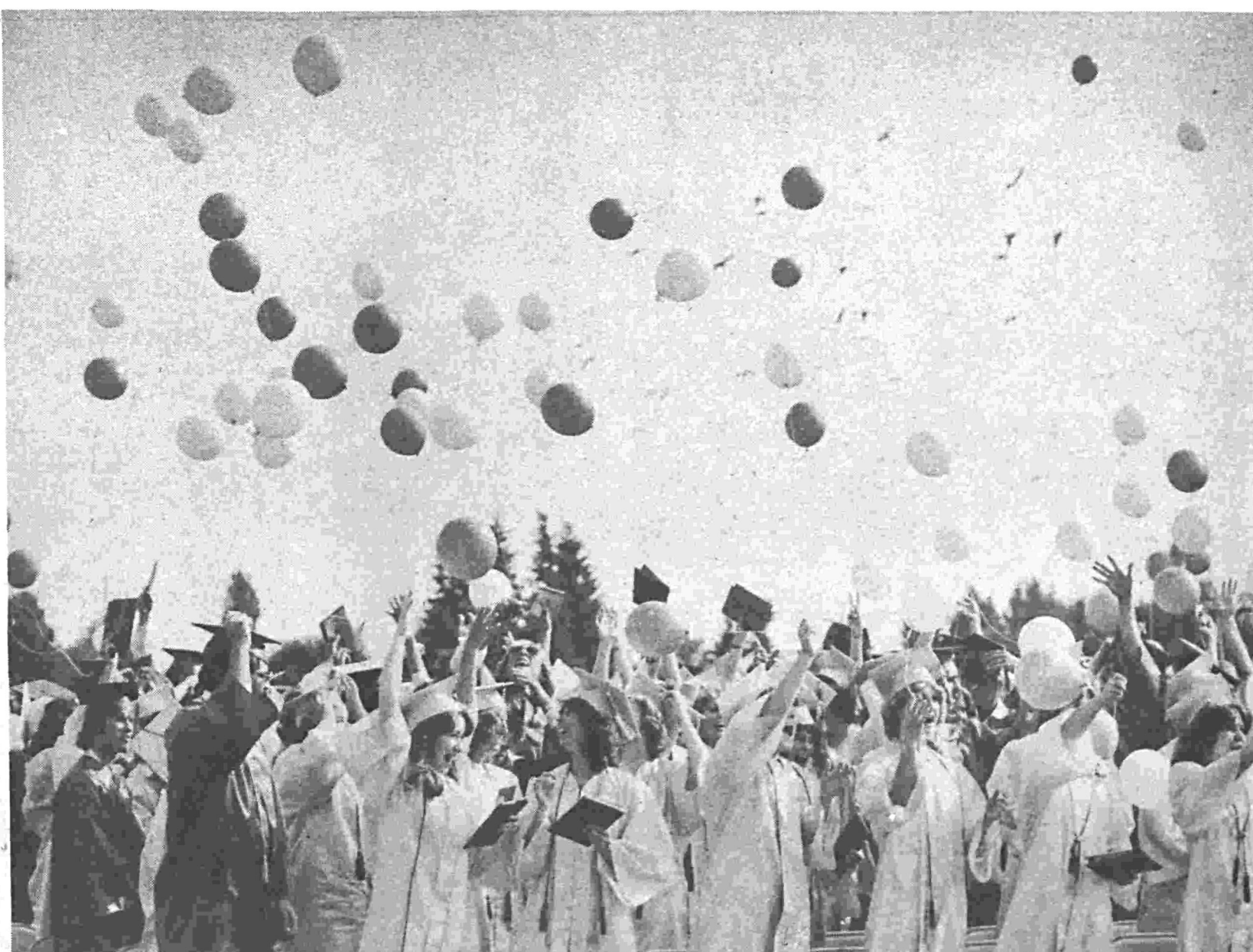

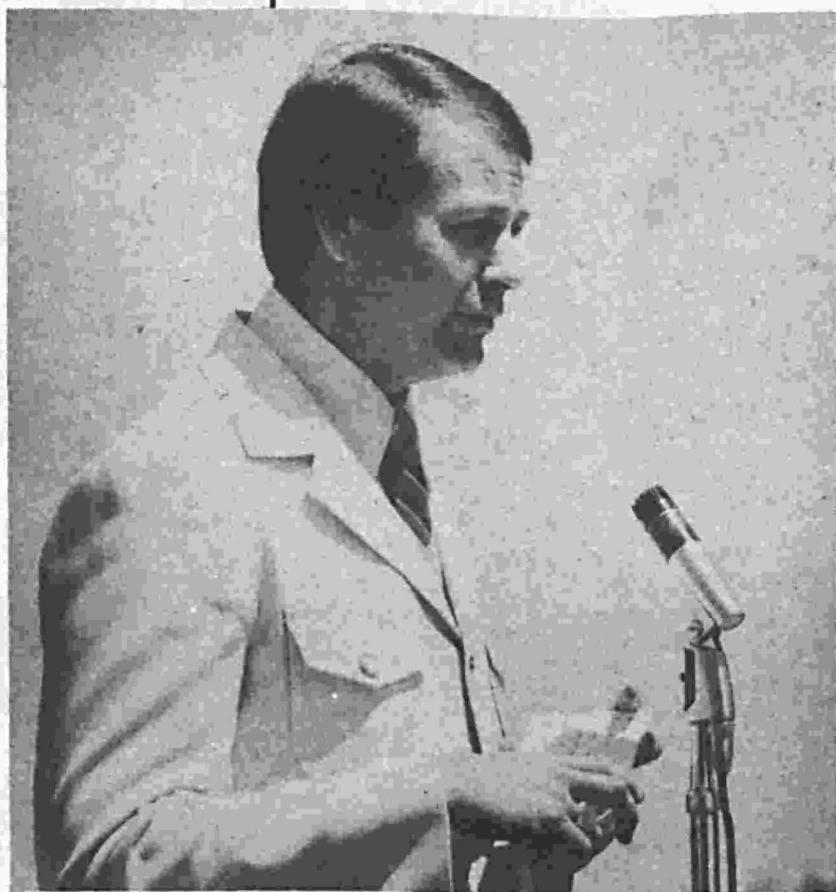
Everybody seemed to realize that it was a time of change.

Peterbilt, which is leading the league with a 15-3 slate, will continue NorWest action tonight with a 7:30 p.m. double-header against Tacoma B and I at Peck Field. The Truckers meet the national-powerhouse Turquoise Kings from Kingman, Arizona in a Saturday double-header at White Center Stadium. The twin bill, which is the first outing of Peter-

bilt's Super Series schedule, will begin at 7:30 p.m. Later Super Series guests this season include Interstate Battery of Worcester, Mass. and All-O-Matic from Saskatoon, Canada.

Peterbilt had little trouble overcoming opponents at Yakima last weekend.

With Arnold spacing three hits in the championship contest, Peterbilt used single runs in the first and second innings to coast by Schlitz.

Mike Bishop opened the finale by bunting his way to first base. Roger Miller followed with a single through the middle. An out later, Rich Fredrickson loaded the bases after being struck with a pitch. Bettineski brought Bishop home with a grounder to second.

Greg Van Gaver began the second inning by sprinting all the way to third when Schlitz dropped his deep fly in right field. With two out, he scored when Bishop again bunted safely to first.

Arnold used a quick-dipping drop and a lethal changeup to keep Schlitz hitters off-balance the entire contest. Dan Thompson's sixth-inning double to left-center was the biggest blow to Ar-

## Outdoor tips and tales

Right now is a good time to begin getting ready for next fall's steelhead season by starting a "study" of one or more of the rivers you plan to fish next winter.

Your "study" should be made primarily with a rod and reel, as you fish the river throughout the months. You'll see it when it's high with spring runoff and when it's low and clear in late summer and fall. As you fish it during the different water levels, you'll learn the holes, the sand bars, dropoffs and the deep runs along steep banks which are hidden when the water level is high or the water dirty.

By the end of your study, you'll know what the bottom is like from looking at the surface. This is one of the surest ways to become one of those anglers who come home with fish when others get only exercise during the course of a day.

As the summer water levels drop and the water becomes clear, you'll realize that some holes are deeper than you expected. You'll see where the deepest channel is and that some places which appear to be channels, become dry sand bars at really low water. All of this is of great value when fishing steelhead or salmon later.

If you're so inclined, you can even make a chart of the river you're checking and jot down notes of what the surface is like at the different water levels over the various kinds of bottom.

By the time you've worked your way through the months, you'll know that river as you know your back yard and you'll be ready to cast into the pathways the steelhead or salmon follow as they come upstream, even though you can't see

those pathways in the winter.

Knowing one river in this way helps when you go to a strange river, for water reacts the same wherever it is and if you can read the surface of one, you can read the surface of a strange one.

The study will also help you find the new holes and bottom features on a winter river following extremely high water. Winter floods on our western rivers change the bottom, washing out bars, filling holes, gouging new ones as they carry logs, trees and tons of sediment downstream.

But once you've come to recognize what's on the bottom by looking at the surface, you can figure out quickly where the new fish-holding areas are.

# Windshield smashed, driver nabs 2 teens

Two suspected teenage terrorists who are charged with hurling rocks through the windshields of passing vehicles were captured Friday after one of their victims crept up on their hiding place and grabbed them as they lurked in the bushes.

The incident occurred at about 10 a.m. on 21st Avenue South near South 330th Street. King County Police are looking for additional victims in the case and want to hear from any other motorists whose vehicles were hit by rocks as they drove through the area.

Both boys were charged with reckless endangerment, a gross misdemeanor, and will be tried in juvenile court. One, a 14-year-old, lives on 22nd Avenue Southwest, while the other, a 12-year-old, lives nearby on 26th Avenue Southwest.

Police say that the motorist who captured the pair was driving north on 21st Avenue South when his windshield disintegrated, showering him with fragments of glass.

When he turned around to investigate, he heard the kids running through the woods. So he drove away to return a few minutes later — just as one of the two hurled another rock at a passing semi-truck, smashing its windshield.

After the motorist, a 29-year-old Federal Way man, had colared the two he notified police.

Police described the suspects as "very defiant." Throwing rocks at moving vehicles, police say, could easily kill or injure the driver and the passengers.

**TWO RESIDENTS** were cited and released and a third is being sought after a neighborhood squabble early Saturday morning turned into a donnybrook in which a King County Police sergeant was severely beaten.

The incident occurred after Sgt. Joseph Bays and officers S.W. Whitehead and B. K. Kalin responded to a complaint that several South 260th Street residents were arguing over an attempt by one resident to cut down another resident's tree.

Shortly after the officers arrived they cited a 22-year-old man on a charge of drinking in public and then charged a 22-year-old woman with obstructing an officer after she allegedly refused to answer questions and became violent.

Police said that the woman's brother suddenly ran outside and shouted that the officers should leave his sister alone. Bays attempted to talk with the man, they said, but the man struck him several times and fled.

A search by the county's K-9 unit later failed to turn up the suspect, who may be charged with aggravated assault.

The circumstances of the incident remained unclear Monday and were being investigated by detectives from the Major Crimes Unit. The suspect was still at large.

**THREE TEENS** accused of breaking open a gate to Dash Point State Park, threatening a park ranger and creating a disturbance were charged with criminal trespass after county police nabbed them in the park at 2:50 a.m. Saturday.

Two of the suspects are 19 years old, while the third is 18. The 18-year-old and one of the 19-year-olds are from Federal Way, while the third is from Tacoma.

Because the three are legally adults, the cases will be tried in the Federal Way district of King County Justice Court.

Police were called to the park by rangers, who said that the trio tried to ram a ranger vehicle with their car.

**ADMITTING THAT** he beat up a 13-year-old Federal Way girl who was his classmate at a local junior high school, a 14-year-old Federal Way boy told police Friday that he had been angered by the victim's "smart talk" during the 1978-79 school year.

The boy waited until the last day of school, tripped the girl and gave her a bloody nose at about

noon at the intersection of 38th Avenue South and South 335th Street. Her parents later called police, who cited the boy on a charge of simple assault and released him in the custody of his parents.

The case will be tried in King County Juvenile Court.

**TWO CASES** of vandalism were reported during the weekend, one of them involving several incidents in which a local school teacher who lives on South 330th Street has been harassed.

Police said that vandals have broken light bulbs, scattered household tools and committed several other minor acts of destruction at the teacher's house.

No motive for the episodes, which have been occurring for the past week, is known.

In the second case, damage amounting to \$50 was done to an automobile parked at a Southwest 308th Street residence sometime Friday.

The vehicle was broken into and the ignition wires were torn out from beneath the dashboard.

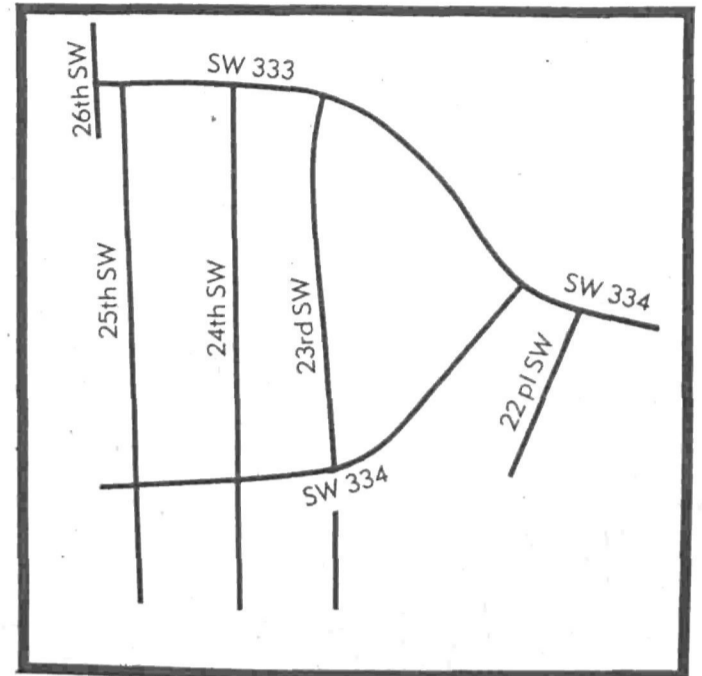
**THIEVES STRUCK** during the weekend in a total of three residential burglaries and ten larcenies. Most of the larcenies involved shoplifting or petty theft, and in four of the cases, arrests were made. None of the burglaries resulted in losses greater than \$350.

But in one of the larcenies, goods and money worth a com-

## Magic Company sells illusions

Man has been fascinated by magical phenomena since he made his debut. That fascination began at an early age for two Federal Way teenagers.

Douglas Endicott and Curtis Smith were doing card and coin tricks in elementary school. Now seniors in high school, Endicott at Bellarmine Preparatory School in Tacoma and Smith at Decatur High School in Federal Way, they have performed with their own business, The Magic Company, for three years.

Since becoming partners when they were in the ninth grade, the magicians have enlarged their show and now have three assistants, all of whom will be seniors at Decatur High School next year.

Brian McMullen and Bryan Osborne set up sound and lighting equipment and help carry equipment onto the stage.

"And we needed a girl," said Smith. "It's the tradition to use a girl in the bigger acts."

True to the show-business tradition of one of their idols, Harry Houdini, the famous turn-of-the-century conjurer who

used his wife as an assistant, they recruited Endicott's girlfriend, Maria Jones.

Miss Jones, who has worked with the wizards regularly for about a year, describes herself as the one who "jumps out of the box." She said she also, among other things, gets cut into four pieces and than is put back together again. And, she added, she even finds herself floating in mid air.

"Doug and Curtis use to do a doll levitation number, where a doll was raised up from a table," she said. "Now they're practicing on me. It's going to be one of our new acts."

The group performs for small parties and for talent shows at their high schools. They also worked at last year's Octoberfest at Bellarmine Preparatory School and did a Masonic convention at the Red Lion Inn near Sea Tac International Airport last fall.

"It's scary, but it's exciting," Miss Jones said. "I don't like to get up in front of people. And if anything goes wrong, if the act fails, there is a lot of pressure."

She said that the big

acts usually do not fail and that in the smaller acts, mistakes can be hidden from the audience.

But one failure could not be covered up. "The Whiskey Barrel Escape" at the Octoberfest last fall ended in near disaster, Smith said.

Locked inside a water-filled whiskey barrel, Endicott's escape mechanism would not work because the water was too warm and had greatly expanded the barrel, he said.

"All of a sudden we heard Doug yelling and knocking on the barrel trying to get out," he said. "We keep a double-bladed axe nearby just in case we need it. Bryan Osborne grabbed the axe and started working on the lid. He finally got it off, and Doug came flying out of there all doubled up."

That was the company's closest call yet, according to Smith. "Doug was scared, but he got back in the barrel at the next performance," he said. "He didn't want to let the audience down."

None of the company members has had formal training. Smith said he and his partner just watch other magicians, try to figure out their routines and improve them, if possible.

The group will not do performances until about mid August. Endicott, son of Cheri and Lynn Endicott of 30205 25th Ave. S.W., is attending a science research training program in Louisiana and Miss Jones will be in Europe for several months. The other assistants are sons of Dean and Doris McMullen of 32113 33rd Ave. S.W. and Jim and Margaret Osborne of 2445 S.W. 306th Place.

Smith said they charge \$20 for an hour-long show at small events, such as birthday parties. Fees for performing the bigger shows range from \$40 to \$75, depending on what goes into the performance, he added.

Their show is a combination of tricks and illusions, according to Smith and Miss Jones. And there is a big difference between the two, they said.

"We use only a few tricks," she said. "A trick is something you set up ahead of time where you have something up your sleeve. Most of our show is made up of illusions, where you don't try to trick the audience; you try to make them see something. An illusion is harder than a trick."

None of the teenage magic vendors is now

planning a career in magic, but like all good magicians, they are not telling how it's

all done. "It's a secret," said Miss Jones, smiling mysteriously.

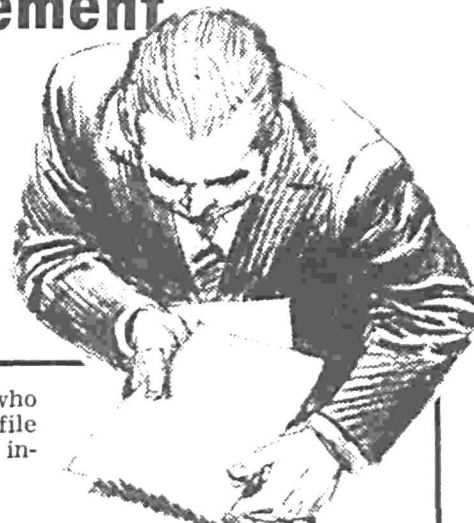

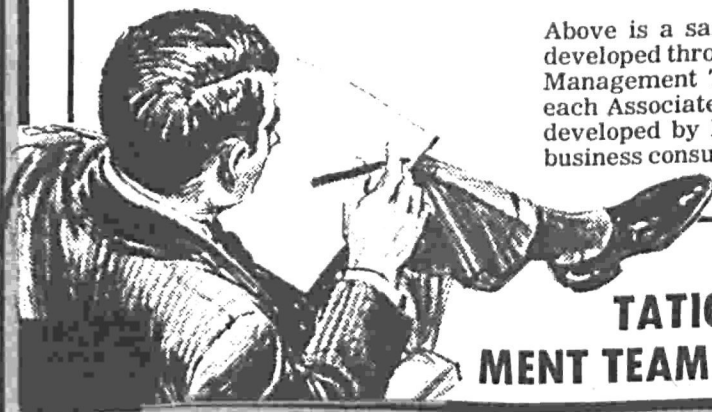

## Getting it on ...the grill

What better way to end the school year and begin summer fun, than with a gigantic barbecue. That's how the 107 Sac-Jawea students in Shirli Jensen's cooking classes wrapped up their final studies.

While some boys and girls gobbled down a hearty pocket stew filled with vegetables and hamburger, others snacked on sugary donut-like "Darn Goods."

The favorite cooking class is designed to introduce students to outdoor cooking, said Ms. Jensen. She instructs the students in the proper safety and cooking techni-

ques when building fires and using grills. Students learned such things as using briquettes instead of pressed sawdust logs and building the fires down wind for better burning control. In class, the students cooked on hibahis since they are protected from the wind.

As a conservation tip, the instructor recommended saving the briquettes once they had cooled down for later use.

Although some of the students were old pros with outdoor cooking and had their own styles, others discovered the meals

could be adapted easily from home to woods.

According to Ms. Jensen the idea behind many of the outdoor recipes are their convenience. Pocket Stew was designed for fishermen to carry their meals easily in a pocket and then placed in warm coals. "Darn Goods" can be fried on a stove as well as in a campfire. However, the instructor recommends the pan be securely placed in the coals if cooked over campfire.

Even though some students hesitantly tasted their own cooking they agreed a barbecue was a terrific way to end school.

**DARN GOODS**  
1 package refrigerator biscuits  
Oil for deep frying  
Cinnamon sugar to taste

Cut each biscuit into fourths. Deep fry biscuits in oil at 375 degrees until golden brown. (If a thermometer is not available, the oil is hot enough when the biscuit dough sinks in the pan and then immediately returns to the surface.)  
After frying, roll

biscuits in cinnamon sugar.  
Darn Goods can be cooked over a campfire in a can. However, be careful of the oil so that it does not catch fire.

**BEEF JERKY**  
This is one-fourth a recipe, since it was used in class. For home, multiply amounts by four.  
¼ pound round steak (or other meat)  
¼ teaspoon liquid smoke  
Few grains garlic or

onion powder  
Few grains black pepper  
¼ teaspoon Accent or MSG  
¼ teaspoon onion powder  
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce  
1 tablespoon soy sauce

Trim off all possible fat. Semi-freeze the meat, and slice it with the grain into one-eighth-inch slices. Marinate overnight in a shallow glass dish thoroughly covered with sauce made from

all the other ingredients.  
Lay strips of marinated meat in single layer on oven racks (place cookie sheet or foil underneath to catch drips). With oven door open a crack, roast at 200 degrees F. for about two hours — taste occasionally till it is chewy as desired. Pieces in oven must not overlap.

**POCKET STEW**  
¼ pound ground beef flattened into patty or

crumbled  
1 onion slice  
1 small potato, sliced, but not peeled (scrub to clean)  
1 small carrot, sliced in rings (not peeled, scrub to clean)  
Salt and pepper  
Place ground beef on double-thickness heavy-duty aluminum foil. Add other ingredients and wrap securely and tightly. Cook on hot coals 25 minutes, turning once. Eat stew from foil packet. Serves one.

3 pints vanilla ice cream  
Combine cookie crumbs and butter. Press mixture evenly over bottom of buttered 9-inch pie plate. Stand whole cookies upright around edge. (Cookies may have to be trimmed if too

long.) Chill. Combine pecans and ice cream topping. Chill. Spoon 1 pint ice cream into cookie shell. Top with 1/2 of ice cream sauce, then 1/2 crushed pineapple. Add additional 1 pint ice cream, then remaining sauce and pineapple. Top with remaining ice cream. Freeze until serving time.

**Rocky Road Ice Cream Torte**  
1/2 gallon chocolate ice cream, softened  
1 cup coarsely broken chocolate wafers (about 12)  
1 cup miniature marshmallows  
1/2 cup broken walnuts  
1/2 cup whipping cream, whipped  
Chocolate sauce  
Stir ice cream to

soften. Fold in cookies, marshmallows and nuts. Pour mixture into 7-cup mold; freeze several hours or overnight. Unmold onto serving plate; garnish around base with whipped cream piped through a pastry tube. Serve with chocolate sauce. 10 to 12 servings.

**Paper Bag Fruit Bread**  
3 eggs  
Two-thirds cup sugar  
1/2 cup butter  
1 cup milk  
3 cups all-purpose flour  
2 1/2 tpsps baking powder  
1/2 tsp salt  
1 tsp grated lemon or orange peel  
2 tpsps anise seed, crushed  
1/4 cup chopped almonds  
1/2 cup chopped mixed candied fruit  
1/2 cup golden raisins

**Huff 'N Puff Potato Biscuits**  
1 pkg active dry yeast  
1/4 cup warm water  
2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour  
1 pkg chicken gravy mix, if desired  
1/2 cup mashed potato flakes  
2 1/2 tbsps sugar  
4 tpsps baking powder  
1/2 tsp soda  
1/2 cup solid vegetable shortening  
1 cup buttermilk  
Melted butter or margarine

Use a paper bag with a bottom measurement of 7 1/2 x 4 1/2 inches. Fold down the top; fold again until secure "cuff" is formed and sides are about 4 inches high. Grease inside of bag well and place on cookie sheet.

Soften yeast in warm water. In large mixing bowl, combine flour, dry gravy mix, dry potato flakes, sugar, baking powder, salt and soda. With pastry blender, cut in shortening. Add yeast mixture and buttermilk. Stir just until well mixed. On floured surface, knead 4 to 6 times, until no longer sticky. Roll out or pat dough to 3/4-inch thickness. Cut into rounds with floured 2-inch cutter. Place on lightly greased cookie sheet. Brush tops of biscuits with melted butter. Bake at 450 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes, or until golden brown.

In small mixer bowl, beat eggs until thick and lemon colored; add sugar and beat 1 minute at high speed. Heat butter and milk in small saucepan until butter melts; set aside. In large mixing bowl, combine flour, baking powder, salt, lemon peel, anise, almonds and fruit. Add beaten egg mixture along with half of the butter and milk mixture. Blend well. Add remaining butter and milk mixture; blend until smooth. Pour into prepared paper bag place on cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees

# What's Cookin' in Ruth's Kitchen

It's like coming in on a wing and a prayer, but I made it to Los Angeles and back just before the DC-10's were grounded. Hope they're fixed and flying again soon, because air travel can give you a weekend in another world and with favorite people. It's a tonic.

Air transport is important for cargo as well as people. Talking with the produce man in one of our markets the other day, he mentioned how international our food supplies have become with jicama from Central America, pineapples from Hawaii and Granny Smith apples and kiwis from New Zealand.

Kiwis are what started our conversation. I saw a box of brown, fuzzy fruits about the size of lemons among the displays. I picked one up, felt its hard skin and sniffed it for its aroma.

"Are these anything like fejoias?" I asked. "Very similar," he said, and he cut into one for me. It was green; so it was firm and sharp but had that wonderful flavor like that of the fejoias we had when I was a youngster in the Los Angeles area. We had a tree in our yard, and Mother used to send me a box of them occasionally after I moved to Seattle.

FEJOIAS have a dark green skin, but when ripe, the inside is soft, juicy and sweet. You cut off the end and put it up to your mouth and squeeze it. Like with any fruit, it's almost impossible to describe the flavor, except that it's like a combination of some of the world's best fruits, a little lime, a little pineapple and maybe a little canteloupe.

Kiwis and fejoias are just about the same except that kiwis, at least those from New Zealand, are brown.

The produce man said they should be left on the kitchen counter until you're sure they're ripe. Press them very gently, as you would an avocado, to see if it gives slightly.

They're expensive but worth it if you like exotic fruits. Mom used to can fejoias and make preserves out of them, but I doubt if you'll do this with kiwis unless they become more plentiful and cheaper.

FRESH PINEAPPLES are probably the best of the fruits that are flown in from faraway places. Canned pineapple is good, and you can depend on its flavor, but a really ripe fresh pineapple has a flavor that's unequalled.

A ripe pineapple has a lot of yellow, and you can smell its aroma, but if you're in doubt about picking a good one, ask any produce man, and he'll be glad to help you.

One caution about fresh pineapples - don't put them in a gelatine salad or dessert. I'm told they contain an enzyme that keeps the gelatine from setting. This is not true of canned pineapple, because heat has destroyed the enzyme.

I went shopping with my daughter in Los Angeles last week, and it was interesting to note the similarity of prices. It doesn't seem to make too much difference whether the produce is grown here or there. Prices looked to be approximately the same. One of the

miracles of transportation.

FRESH PRODUCE comes and goes so fast that we should be reminded that asparagus won't be around too long, in case you're planning on putting any away for the future. It will never be cheap, but you'll find it cheaper

someplaces than others.

If you insist on canning it, use a pressure cooker, and follow the directions to the letter, but I would much prefer to freeze it. It's totally safe, no danger of botulism, and it's easier.

The government bulletin recommends sorting the spears as to thickness before blanching them, dropping them in boiling water. The thinner stalks take only two minutes of rapid boiling and the thicker ones as much as four minutes. They are then drained and plunged into very cold water for rapid cooling.

The spears are then ready to be carefully packed in containers for freezing, and the bulletin recommended putting some up and some down to get a full pack.

Asparagus tips are so fragile they deserve to be handled with care, whereas green beans, which I always freeze in large

quantities during the summer, can be put in plastic bags any old way after blanching.

BLANCHING is a step that a lot of people have been skipping in recent years and claim that the vegetables are all right when just washed, trimmed and frozen. But I think I'll continue to blanch my vegetables until the Extension Service says otherwise. Blanching is done to destroy certain enzymes which can

cause color and flavor to deteriorate, and it's really not much bother.

If you're planning on canning or freezing food of any kind for the first time, it would be well to watch the news for a Master Canning Session in your area, ask the Extension Service if there's going to be one in your area, or ask them for printed information on whatever you want to can or freeze. Their information is accurate, up-to-the-

minute and free. You'll find the offices of both King and Pierce County Extension Service listed under Cooperative Extension Service in the phone books.

I ATE LOTS of good food while on my recent sojourn, but nothing that I didn't know about already, including a good Mexican dinner on Olivera Street before going to that wonderful new musical, "Evita" at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion.

Farmer's Market, which is a fine place for people-watching and ate lunch at an outdoor table, hamburgers in pita, pocket bread and some awfully good relishes on the side. One was a dish of spiced sliced carrots, something that anybody could make for themselves. Here's how:

**Spiced Carrots**  
3 cups sliced carrots  
1 medium onion  
¼ cup chopped parsley  
1 teaspoon salt

dash of black pepper  
½ cup sugar  
½ cup vinegar  
½ cup vegetable oil  
½ teaspoon sweet basil  
Cut scraped carrots in half inch slices and cook 10 to 15 minutes so they are tender but crisp. Put salt, pepper, sugar, vinegar and oil in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Pour hot over cooked carrots, sliced onions, parsley and basil. Let stand several hours or overnight in the refrigerator before serving.

*Swiss cheese is basis for variety of dishes*

The Swiss are famous for their cheese. They live in a country that is conducive to dairy farming, and the milk produced on these farms is what makes the fabulous Swiss cheese. There are two primary types of Swiss cheese: Gruyere and Emmentaler. The flavor of the dish will change depending on which one is used. Emmentaler will produce a

milder taste than Gruyere. The two cheeses may be used interchangeably or jointly to please the consumer. All cheese dishes should be cooked over low heat to prevent the cheese from becoming tough and stringy. One pound of any Swiss cheese makes four cups of grated cheese. Here are ways the Swiss use their cheese:

Sauteed

**Cheese Dumplings**  
2 and one-third cups grated Gruyere or Emmentaler cheese  
¼ cup dairy sour cream  
4 egg yolks  
¼ cup all-purpose flour  
½ tsp salt  
½ tsp dry mustard  
¼ tsp pepper  
Butter for sauteing  
Mix together the cheese, sour cream and egg yolks. Beat in the flour which has been sifted with the

salt, mustard and pepper. Melt butter into a large skillet to a depth of ½ inch. Add tablespoons of the cheese mixture. Saute until golden brown; turn and saute on other side. Serve hot with a green vegetable.  
**Puffy Cheese Sandwiches**  
2 eggs, separated  
½ lb Swiss cheese (about 2 cups, grated)  
½ tsp salt  
¼ tsp pepper  
12 slices firm white bread, thinly sliced

**Butter Cheese Tart**  
Beat the egg yolks. Blend with cheese, salt and pepper. Fold the egg white into cheese mixture. Spread on 6 of the bread slices. Top with remaining bread slices. Press together. Saute in ¼ inch hot butter on both sides until golden brown.  
**Dough:**  
3 cups all-purpose flour  
1 tsp salt  
¾ cup butter or

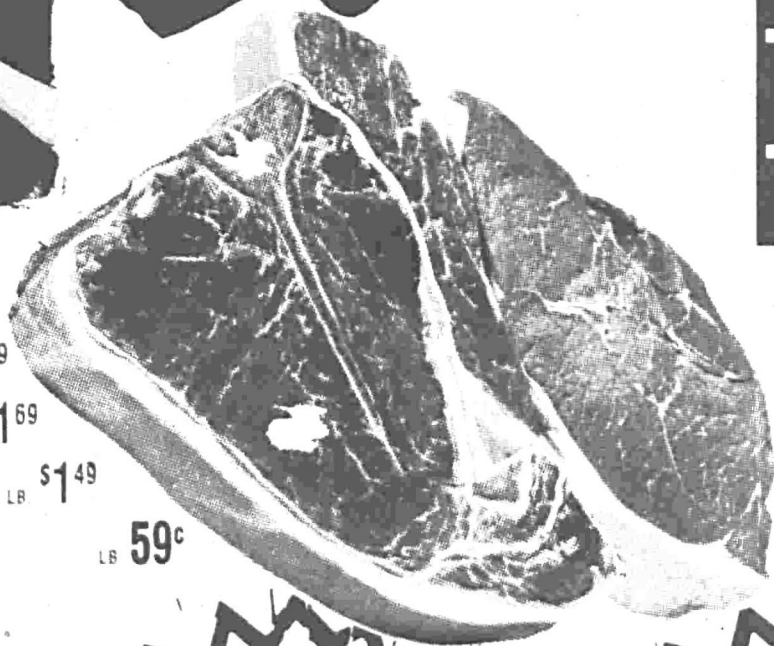
homogenized shortening  
7 tbsps water  
1 tbsps vinegar  
**Filling:** ¼ lb Emmentaler cheese, cut into ¼-inch slices  
1 and two-thirds cups milk  
2 tbsps flour  
2 egg yolks  
1 tsp salt  
¼ tsp nutmeg  
2 egg whites  
To make the dough, sift flour with salt. Cut in shortening until the particles are the size of small peas. Add water and vinegar. Stir until the dough clears the bowl. Knead on a lightly floured board. Let the dough rest 30 minutes. Roll out thinly to fit the bottom and sides of a 15 x 10-inch jelly roll pan. Price the crust with a fork. After the pan has been prepared, place slices of cheese over the crust. For the filling, add milk gradually to the flour. Beat in egg yolks, salt and nutmeg. Fold in egg white which have been stiffly beaten. Pour mixture evenly over the cheese. Bake in a preheated 400-degree oven for 20 to 25 minutes until golden brown. Cut into squares and serve hot.  
**Baked Cheese Pudding**  
4 eggs, separated  
2 cups heavy cream  
1 cup grated Swiss cheese  
½ tsp salt  
6 slices firm white bread  
¼ cup melted butter  
Beat egg yolks. Mix with cream, cheese and salt. Beat egg whites until stiff; fold into the egg yolk mixture. Saute bread in heated butter on both sides until golden. Grease a 9 x 9-inch baking dish. Place overlapping bread slices in it. Pour the cheese mixture over bread. Place baking dish in pan of hot water. Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven for 35 to 40 minutes or until the pudding is golden brown and puffed. Serve immediately with a green vegetable. Makes 6 servings.

½ tsp each nutmeg, cinnamon, ginger  
¼ cup butter or margarine

Make up pastry from your favorite mix or recipe; form into an 11-inch circle. Place a circle of foil a little larger all around than the pastry on a cookie sheet and top with pastry circle. 

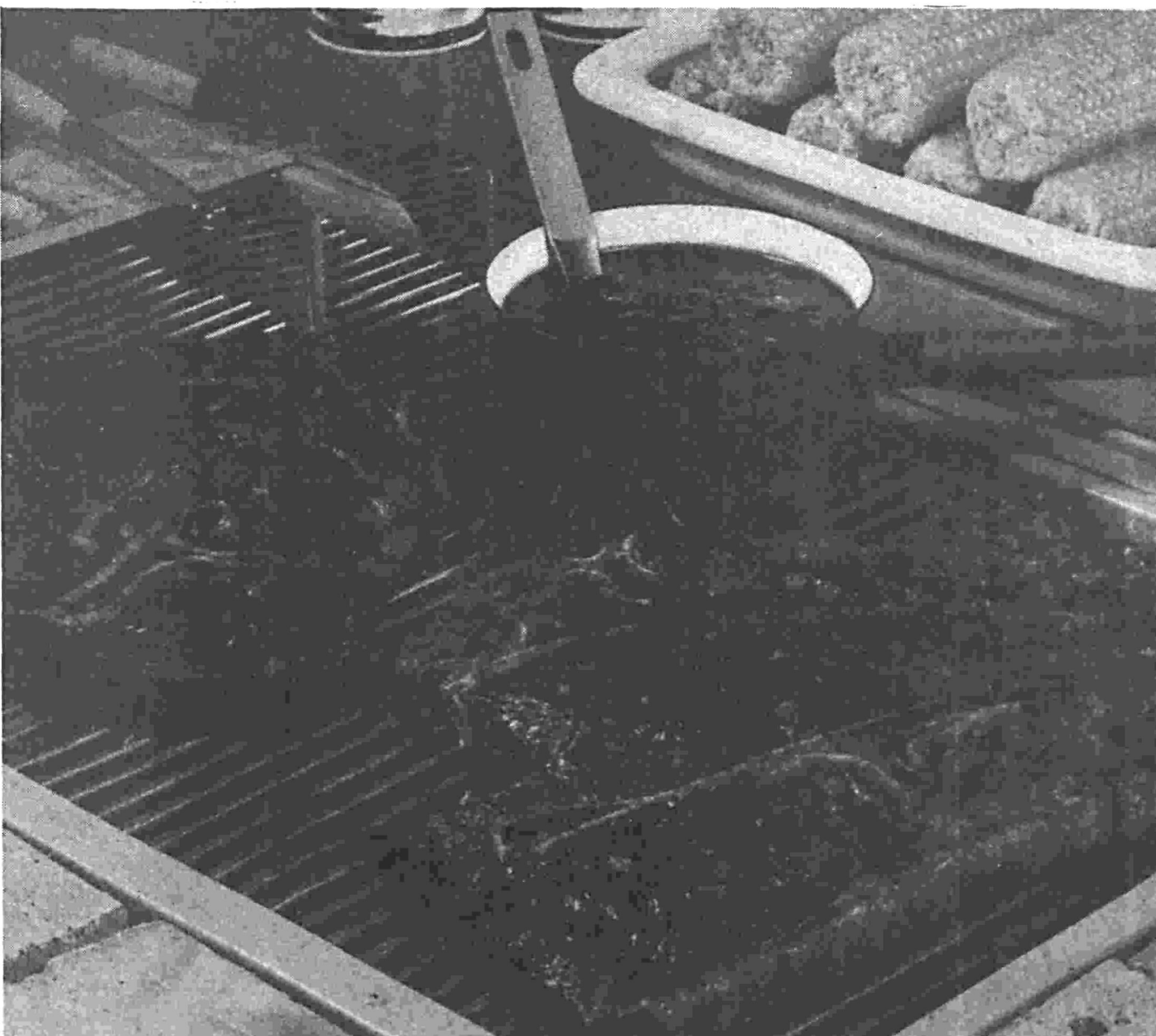

  - ½ tsp worcestershire sauce
  - One-eighth tsp celery seed
  - One-eighth tsp rosemary
  - One-eighth tsp pepper
  - 2 2-½-pound broiler-fryers, halved

Combine all ingredients, except chicken, in container of blender; cover and process at medium speed 1 minute. Brush chicken with sauce and place bone side down on grill. Cook over slow coals, turning occasionally and basting frequently. Cook about 1 hour, or until meat is tender and skin is crisp.

- Savory Drumsticks**
- ¼ cup catsup
  - 2 to 3 tbsps lemon juice
  - 2 tbsps soy sauce
  - ¼ cup cooking oil
  - 12 chicken drumsticks

Combine catsup, lemon juice, soy sauce and oil. Add chicken legs and turn to coat. Refrigerate overnight, turning several times. Drain, reserving marinade. Place drumsticks on preheated grill. Cook over medium coals about 1 hour, or until tender. Baste with reserved marinade and turn every 15 minutes.

- Lemon-Plus Chicken**
- ½ cup butter or margarine, melted
  - ½ tsp paprika
  - 3 tbsps sugar
  - ¼ cup lemon juice
  - 2 tps worcestershire sauce
  - 2 broiler-fryers, halved
  - 2 tps salt
  - ½ tsp pepper

Combine butter, paprika, sugar, lemon juice and worcestershire. Place chicken on grill. Sprinkle with salt and pepper; brush with butter mixture. Cook approximately 1 hour, or until done, turning and basting every 15 minutes. 4 servings.

**Chocolate Cheesecake** is "trendy" right now. But even if you have no interest in being au courant, you'll like this Chocolate Chip Cheese Cake - and so will everyone who shares it.

For a very different

cheesecake, Tropical Cheesecake Delight sandwiches a combination of sliced banana and mandarin oranges between coconut-flavored cheesecake layers.

This version makes a lighter-textured dessert because the sour cream topping is folded into the cheesecake. The tropical flavors are

just right for warm weather, and it "bakes" in the refrigerator.

- Chocolate Chip Cheesecake**
- 1 pkg no-bakes creamy cheesecake mix
  - 3 tbsps sugar
  - 7 ½ tbsps melted butter or margarine
  - 2 oz (2 squares) semi-sweet chocolate,

coarsely chopped  
½ cup milk

Combine graham crumbs from mix, sugar and 4 ½ tablespoons butter or margarine. Press mixture firmly and evenly against bottom and sides of 9-inch pie pan. In small bowl blend cheesecake filling mix, 3 tablespoons margarine and 1 ½ cups milk at lowest speed until moistened.

Beat 2 minutes at high speed. Carefully fold in chocolate. Spread evenly in crust. In small bowl blend sour cream topping mix from package and ½ cup milk at lowest speed until moistened. Beat 1 minute at medium speed until smooth and thickened. Spread evenly over filling. Chill at least 30 minutes. Store leftovers covered in

refrigerator. 8 servings.

**Tropical Cheesecake Delight**

- 1 pkg cheesecake pie mix
- 3 tbsps sugar
- 7 ½ tbsps melted margarine or butter
- ½ cup coconut
- 1 ¼ cups milk
- 11-oz can mandarin oranges, well drained and blotted dry
- 1 medium banana,

sliced  
2 tbsps coconut

Combine graham crumbs from mix, sugar and 4 ½ tablespoons margarine. Press mixture firmly and evenly against bottom and sides of 9-inch pie pan. In small bowl blend cheesecake filling mix, sour cream topping mix, 3 tablespoons margarine, coconut and milk on lowest

speed until moistened. Beat 2 minutes at highest speed. Spread ½ of prepared filling evenly in bottom of crust. Distribute oranges and bananas evenly over filling in the crust. Spread remaining filling over fruit. Sprinkle 2 tablespoons coconut over pie. Chill pie at least 30 minutes. Store leftovers covered in refrigerator.
