Relief, but no bucks, planned for highway flooding here

by Nathalie Weber Those motorists who suffered soggy brakes or were late for an appointment last week because of he flooding on Pacific Highway South next to SeaTac Mall may be
consoled in that the government is drafting a solution to the drainage problem there.
But don't expect miracles. It could be a year before the project to keep heavy rain from building
up on the highway will even be initiated, King County Public Works reports.
So far, all that's been determined is that there is a problem with drainage on Pacific Highway South between South 320th and
326th streets. A solution also has 326th streets. A solution also has
been devised, but there's one lit-
tle catch: there's no federal, state or county
It's a problem with a $\$ 3$ million solution, Larry Gibbons, south
section supervisor for hydraulics, said Wednesday, a price tag that he described as a very high cost."
THE PROBLEM with the highly-developed stretch of Pacific Highway is that the drainage system that 'presently serves the area was constructed
for more land and less concrete. As more concrete is poured over the remaining earth, more rain runs off instead of soaking into
the ground, creating pools of water on the street.
That street was closed at least
three times in the last week as on the highway, creating a hazard to motorists. Public works, which is working with the State Department of Transportation to solve the pro-
blem, said studies completed last June of the drainage system indicated that the best solution will
be to increase the size of the be to increase the size of the
culculverts serving the area. An additional retention pond also is being considered near South 348th Street to hold the water until it is
piped about a mile south into the piped about a mile south into to
Hylebos Creek, Gibbons said.
THE MAJOR item now is how to fund the project. Since no government funds are available,
Gibbons suggested the project be
funded through a Local Improve ment District (LID) that would require property owners adjacen: improvements. improvements. "The dollars just are not, available now and I don't know of any that are coming up later," he
said. "A LID is the only way I can For now nothing will be don until the county completes a similar project in Kirkland's Juanita district. "We intend to
benefit in how to benefit in how to conduct such a
project by doing this one first. It's. project by doing this one first. It's
better than dealing with two iden tical problems at the same time, Gibbons said.
The Juanita project is ten The Juanita project is ten
tatively scheduled for completion in about a year.

means loneliness, despair, and shattered illusions. "People expect to be in a situation of great joy and excitement," said
Dorothy Swanberg, clinical direc tor of Valley City Mental Health that services Federal Way, Auburn, Renton and Kent. " When they don't find themselves in that
situation, they are often depress-
ed" Clinics that handle mental depressions, report that the hardest problems for people to
face usually concern divorce, death , financial set-back or separation from their spouse. More often than not, the clients
are women who have no family and no one to share their concerns with.
If they ha

If they have children, they are faced with the responsibilities of
buying gifts, often with reduced buying gifts, often with reduced
income and providing a semblance of holiday cheer.
