

## **City sifting** Voters must make council picks soon

Federal Way voters have had their work cut out for them sifting through the qualifications and opinions of the 37 people running for city council.

For voters who have yet to make up their minds on who to vote for in each of the seven positions, time is running short.

The primary election, which will whittle the field down to a pair of candidates per position, is only two days away. The polls will open at 7 a.m. Tuesday, May 16, and close at 8 p.m. that same day.

One last opportunity remains for voters to meet at least some of the candidates. The Federal Way First! Transition Team is sponsoring an open house for the candidates at 8:30 p.m. tomorrow at the old fire station at South 312th Street and 28th Avenue South.

The open house will be held after the transition team's weekly 7:30 p.m. meeting. The public is invited to the meeting as well as the open house.

The transition team is an offshoot of a group that led the campaign for Federal Way's incorporation. The team, a selfappointed, volunteer advisory group, is working to lay the groundwork for Federal Way's evolution into cityhood.

Detailed information about each of the people running for city council is contained in a voter's guide that was published in Wednesday's Federal Way News. A limited number of free copies of the guide remain available at the newspaper office, 1634 S. 312th St.

Also, a sample ballot containing the newspaper's endorsements appears on page 2 of today's Federal Way News.

## Drawing the line Single boundary plan takes a bow

If you were expecting a couple of sets of scenarios for elementary school boundary changes next year, you may be disappointed.

There's really only one.

Federal Way School District administrators unveiled computer-drawn scenarios for proposed new school boundaries at a public meeting Thursday afternoon. Version 1 puts all 9,000-plus elementary students in the schools nearest their homes, but could not be used because it leaves gaps of unhoused students between those boundaries in several areas. Scenario 2 refines Scenario 1 by adjusting some boundaries and designating

schools for students in those gaps. The plan would move a quarter of the district's students.

Scenarios 3, 4 and 5 project possible elementary school boundaries for 1992.

Several school board members said they were surprised that essentially one proposal was presented for the 1989-90 school year.

None of the three was particularly displeased, however.

"What I thought we would get was several options, but what I was looking for from the beginning was one brutal computer assessment of the best plan," said board member Jim Boldt.

"In retrospect, one is fine. I don't know what we would have done with a bunch of them," said Nancy Robertson, board president.

Dolores Gibbons, assistant superintendent for elementary education, said she never planned to present more than one set of boundary options for the coming school year. Superintendent Richard Harris said the plan may have called for more earlier, but boundary preparations, such as composing a detailed map, took longer than expected.

THURSDAY NIGHT'S meeting featured a colorful display of neon lines and dots, bidden from a computer and flashed on the wall for all to see. It was the debut of the GeoBased System, a software system designed for boundary changes, which the district has purchased for \$50,000. Computer experts in California ran the system this year, but the software will be in district hands by the time boundaries are redrawn again next year.

About 100 parents, principals and members of a district housing committee craned their necks as a district computer operator punched up drawings of districtwide boundaries and proposed boundary changes for individual schools.







each position will advance to Sept. 19 final election.

How to vote: This will not be a vote-by-mail election such as the March 14 incorporation election. Voters must go to their precinct polling places to cast their ballots unless they have arranged to obtain an absentee ballot. Call King County Records and Elections for more information at 296-1565.

Number of council positions: Seven. Non-partisan. Elected at large, not by districts, so voters can cast ballots for one person in each position.

Length of terms: All positions in this year's elections will be for two-year terms. In 1991, four of the positions will become fouryear terms and three will remain two-year terms. In 1993, the three two-year terms also will become four-year terms.

Salary: Council members will receive \$400 a month. The council will elect one of its members mayor and that person will receive an extra \$100 a month. The mayor will have no more legal authority than other council members, but will preside over council meetings and handle other ceremonial duties.

Date of official incorporation: Sometime between the Sept. 19 final election and March 10, 1990.

Boundaries: To be eligible to vote in the city council election, you must be a registered voter living in the new city's boundaries. The boundaries are: Interstate 5 on the east, Puget Sound on the west, the Pierce County line on the south and a combination of South 272nd Street and the old Water District 56 boundary on the north

about these two. A likely title might be "I Was a Teen-age Merchandising

Mogul." Originally, Marsh and Johnson worked with three other students as members of their DECA project, but the two soon turned corporate hatchet-men and "fired" the other three members, they said.

They also dropped their DECA status and began working on a commission basis for Nordesign.

They decided to market new sweatshirts with the word Nordesign on them instead of Federal Way incorporation because the incorporation shirts have a limited appeal.

Marsh and Johnson planned an entire marketing campaign using new fluorescent sweatshirts Wheeler designed.

They met with Nordstrom buyers last month and made their first sale. The sweatshirts are in production and should be in stores July 1. They will cost China to purchase raw materials for the clothing line Nordesign eventually hopes to produce.

MARSH IS making a trip to Los Angeles soon to visit friends, but also plans to meet with representatives of a dye company.

The two get time off from school and class credit to work for Nordesign and both say they're learning an enormous amount.

"You're always learning something new about business,' said Marsh.

"We're getting the personal satisfaction of starting our own business," said Johnson. "It's such a kick to be 17 and help create a company."

However, they don't deny the most obvious appeal of their work

"I've always been a moneyoriented kind of guy," Johnson said.



## A day to remember: Women share memories of mom

### Peacemaker role runs in the family

#### By LYNN KEEBAUGH

Carolyn Hayek remembers her mother as the family and neighborhood peacemaker.

"She was always good about setting up situations to get people back together again. When different women in the neighborhood would be having disputes, she would be above all that. She always got along with everybody," Hayek recalled recently about her mother, Marion Hayek, now 72.

Now Carolyn Hayek is a peacemaker of sorts. The Federal Way District Court judge spends her days solving disputes, but she wonders "if I'm as good a peacemaker as she is.'

Hayek, 40, is a mother now, too. She and her husband Steve Rosen have a son, Jonathan, 9, and a daughter, Laura, who's almost 2. She's learning what her mother discovered more than three decades ago about balancing a career and family life.

Although her mother earned a bachelor's degree in economics and often worked as a secretary, Hayek remembers her as a "stay-at-home mom," meaning she worked, but was there to be a Camp Fire Leader and to monitor her daughter's involvement in school and extracurricular activities.

She also was active in the American Association of University Women, church, Sunday school and her college sorority. Following her mother's example, Hayek keeps busy with her family and outside in-

terests, such as sitting on the board of directors of the Federal Way Women's Network and having recently finished a threeyear term on the board of directors for First Unitarian Church. Last year she also was a Cub Scout den leader for her son's pack.

Hayek said she always valued education and as a youngster strived for perfection, despite her mom's standard reprise of "Just do the best you can."

"But that was no good," she said laughing. "I always thought the best I could do would be straight As."

Her parents also valued education, she said, and showed it in a number of ways. One of her mother's favorite sayings, was one oft-repeated to her by her own parents.

"My mom always said her parents always said, 'An education is something nobody can ever take away from you.' "

So when the Hayek family moved to Washington in 1959 from Oregon, they chose to live on Mercer Island because their research showed it had some of the best schools around. When Hayek chose the expensive and distant Carleton College in Minnesota, her mother went along with her decision, although she wanted her daughter closer to home.

And her parents continued to support her, financially as well, as she went on to the University of Chicago for law school, even though they had to spend their life savings.

"I was in my second year of law school before it dawned on me what a hardship my education had been for them," she recalled.

Now that her mother is retired, she and Hayek's father, Robert, 77, spend half the year in Hemet, Calif., where they are enjoying their golden years. Hayek jokes that they're becoming more like her all the time.

In years past, though her mother was active in outside activities, she was more of a participant than a leader. Now. Marion and Robert are King and Queen of the recreational vehicle park where they spend their winters and Marion is president of the park's chorus.

"They're taking charge now and having a great time," Hayek said.

### Mom fueled Blackburn's ambitions

Bank executive Joyce Blackburn has been handling money professionally since she was a 13-year-old working at West Seattle's Admiral Theater. Now almost 44, Blackburn is residential lending manager at the SeaTac branch of Puget Sound National Bank. Sitting in her private office overlooking South 320th Street, Blackburn recalled that she's held one job or another ever since working at the Admiral.

She attributes her work habit to her Midwestern roots- her mother was the daughter of an Oklahoma police officer.

She attributes her success in the banking industry to the positive attitude her mother always strove to give her. Her mother, Mary Trotman George, now lives in Auburn.

"I can remember how she always told me I can do anything," Blackburn said.

Blackburn said she enjoyed an unusual relationship with her mother, who married young and had her only daughter when she was still in her teens. The two grew up together, Blackburn said.

She described her family as "traditional." Her father worked for Boeing (34 years, 2 months) and her mother was a homemaker and mom to her daughter and son. Her father, she said, was strict but protective. She described her mother as empathetic.

Their open parenting style helped her to intelligently navigate her teen-age years in the late 1950s. Blackburn recall-

"Her attitude was, 'If you want a beer, come have one. If you want a cigarette, let's try it,"" Blackburn said, although, she pointed out, she wasn't inclined to be a troublemaker as a teen.

Blackburn said she always knew she wanted both a career and a family. In high school in West Seattle, she took as many business classes as she could and attended the American Institute of Banking after graduation. She recalled her first hunt for a professional job, back in 1963. Those were the days, she said, of putting on a suit and a hat and gloves and heading downtown on a bus to knock on doors. Her mother would always be there to see her off to the bus, offering a word of encouragement until she landed her first job as a new accounts clerk. She worked her way up to branch manager in 1979.

"They are proud of what I have accomplished," she said.

In that time, she has managed to blend marriage and motherhood (she has two children in their teens) with her career by carefully following the example her mother set.

"The biggest thing I have to remind myself is to take time to listen," she said. "She always took time to listen."

Blackburn will honor her mother today with a practical token of her appreciation and affection - a new garbage disposal system.

### Southern lady set standards, but had the strength to bend

Clara Seibold of Broussard, La., set some high standards of academic excellence and personal conduct for her four sons and one daughter.

College was to be a matter of course for her children and each of her offspring received liberal doses of wisdom through the maxims of "Poor Richard's Almanac," Shakespeare and other quotables.



## Gators knock off Federal Way, Rogers

Decatur closed out its girls' softball season by sending the top two teams in the South Puget Sound League into next week's West Central District Tournament on a losing note.

The Gators scored three runs in the bottom of the seventh Thursday to humble previously undefeated Rogers, 6-5, one day after holding off second-place Federal Way, 5-4.

The Gators finished one game shy of the playoff standard at an even 10-10, however.

"It was a frustrating season," said Flynn. "We lost six one-run games. If we had just split them..."

THE WAY Decatur played its last two games, it's hard to believe it could have lost any games, let alone commit 13 errors in a 17-3 loss to Thomas Jefferson Tuesday.

The defense was sound both against Federal Way and Rogers, with only two errors and one error, respectively.

"We wanted to get a little redemption from the TJ game," said Flynn. "We know we aren't that bad."

Tanya Fischer stood out Wednesday by throwing out five Eagles and catching three balls in the air, while left-fielder Kim Houston was dazzling Thursday. Houston made five catches against the Rams, including two right along the foul line and one going back on a deep drive.





## Proposed boundaries make way for Silver Lake

south Federal Way. New boundaries will be felt the most there because of a new school to be built in West Campus by fall 1990.

Proposed changes to exisiting boundaries include:

 Federal Way's new West Campus school, Silver Lake, will be bounded by South 320th Street to the north, First Avenue South to the east, Southwest Campus Drive to the south and 21st Avenue Southwest to the west.

That would bring together 500 students who previously attended Brigadoon, Lake Grove and Panther Lake school. They will meet as a school next year at the old Mark Twain Elementary School, near Star Lake.

Nautilus' boundaries are shifted east, making room for Adelaide boundaries to likewise shift east and give students to Twin Lakes from the westward tip of Federal Way. Adelaide's boundaries now meander along the waterfront, but the proposed boundaries would split waterfront students between that

school and Twin Lakes.

· Brigadoon would lose some students who live on the east side of a long, deep ravine at about 32nd Avenue Southwest. Those students would attend Olympic View. Olympic View would lose some students to its southeast border, either to Panther Lake or Silver Lake.

· Mirror Lake boundaries would extend to Interstate 5 to the east, taking students from Wildwood to Lakeland.

· Sunnycrest would gain about 45 students from Star Lake when its southern boundary is tugged

down to a ravine at about South 262nd Street.

GIBBONS WARNED that several factors may result in changes to the proposed boundaries. The boundaries were drawn up with December enrollment figures, for instance, and newer, larger numbers could require boundary adjustment.

Also, special education and gifted students in special classes were not treated separately in the scenario, but added in with other students. Gibbons said both special ed and GATE (gifted) classes would likely be

distributed more evenly throughout the district next year.

Also important to the setting of next year's school boundaries are the reactions of parents. Parents could have better boundary suggestions to make, or could know of some reason why proposed changes won't work, Gibbons said.

The public is invited to comment on boundary changes at three meetings. The first will be held tomorrow night at Thomas Jefferson High School, the second on Tuesday night at Federal Way High School and the third on Thursday night at Panther Lake Elementary. All three will begin at 7 p.m.

Detailed maps of proposed boundaries will be available at each meeting. Maps also are expected to be available Monday at school district headquarters, 31405 18th Ave. S.

For more information, call the district at 941-0100.

The school board is expected to adopt a set of boundary plans at its May 22 meeting, held at school district headquarters. The meeting begins at 7 p.m.

## Shoppers can expect more picket lines

Union picketers were out Friday at Federal Way Albertson's grocery stores and union officials say shoppers should expect them soon at more grocery stores.

Negotiations for both sides in the contract dispute between more than 10,000 store employees and management for

several store chains failed to reach an agreement by Wednesday's midnight deadline. Pickets began appearing around King County Thursday.

United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 1105 spokesman Roger Yockey said he expects management at more stores to begin locking out striking workers at any time. Food Giant stores and Albertson's were the only stores being picketed Friday afternoon, although some stores were advertising for new hires in anticipation of locking out union workers.

The union has told workers to keep reporting to work until told



otherwise, or until they are locked out by their stores. Yockey explained that grocers may combat the union's selective picketing with a massive lockout at all affected stores. The union will picket any store that locks out its employees, he said. Yockey said the union's con-
