

In charge County proposes to run city in 1990

A proposal to continue King **County** management of Federal Way through 1990, even after the community officially incorporates, is being greeted with some skepticism by most city council candidates.

But most said they are still open to negotiation.

The Federal Way News contacted 11 of the 14 candidates to get their opinions on the pro-posal from King County Councilman Paul Barden.

Specifically, Barden is propos-ing that the county pay a \$100,000 start-up grant to both Sea-Tac and Federal Way as soon as the city councils are chosen in the Seat 19 clostics chosen in the Sept. 19 election.

That \$100,000 would be used to pay salaries and benefits of council members, hire staff, pay operating expenses, pay for con-sultants, and pay for any other costs associated with starting the new cities.

The county also would pay \$500,000 to both cities in 1990 to

be used for the same costs. It would continue to provide all services it currently provides through 1990 even after the coun-cils pass resolutions officially incorporating the cities.

However, in return, the county would continue to collect all tax revenues that would otherwise go to the new cities.

The proposal would allow the county to continue operations without reducing staff and would help ensure an orderly transition from county to city government, Barden stated in a letter to candidates dated Aug.

"It provides our citizens with continued services without disruption," Barden stated. "It provides your city the opportunity to recruit and acquire staff in an orderly fashion, while affording the county an opportuni-ty to reduce staff at a similar rate."

on Friday with attempted murder, rape, kidnap and robbery of a Federal Way girl, also will be investigated for any possible connection with other sexual assaults in this state and in Arizona.

Documents filed with King County Superior Court say that Carl William Klusman wrote of his fantasies to rape and kill a young woman in the woods. He also reportedly asked police to lock him up, or he would kill his next victim.

In the charges filed Friday by the King County Prosecutor, Klusman, 29, was accused of atp.m., Tuesday, Aug. 8. ACCORDING TO court

documents, Klusman allegedly drug the girl into the bushes, and raped her at knifepoint. When the victim tried to run away, Klusman reportedly jabbed her in the stomach with his knife.

Charges state that he bound the victim's hands and feet with her clothing, trying twice to strangle her as she struggled.

The victim told police that Klusman thought she was dead, and he tried to bury her with branches and dirt.

eniors fret about full funding

Inquiring minds want to know. Who's going to foot the Federal Way Senior Center bills once Federal Way becomes a city?

Senior center officials are trying to find answers to that question so they can get on with regular business. To do so, they are pinning down the 14 city council candidates by sending them a senior issues

survey and inviting them to a senior issues forum at 7 p.m. at the center Thursday.

The local senior center, with its 1,500 members, rests outside the incorporation boundaries of Federal Way. But slightly more than half (52.1 percent) of those members live inside the city limits. In the past, King County has provided upwards of 40 percent of center funding. The rest comes

from grants, gifts and fundraising. This year, roughly \$40,000 of the center's \$89,000 budget has come from the county.

But county officials say that may change. The county has funded senior centers in unicorporated areas and in towns of 12,000 or fewer folk, but won't fit either of those criteria once the city incorporates, said Gene Brooks,

coordinator for the Aging Program in the county's Human Services Division.

BROOKS SAID the county still is hammering out a transition and long-range plan for senior center funding in Federal Way and Des Moines, which also serves the new city of Sea-Tac. It isn't concrete,

Council candidates are taught lesson on ethics

City council candidates from Sea-Tac and Federal Way took a test on ethics this week. No one got the right answer.

The informal test was administered during a workshop sponsored by the Association of Washington Cities (AWC) on legal and ethical issues.

Some of the workshop, the fifth of six AWC workshops, dealt with the mountain of statutory requirements, resolutions and ordinances the councils will have to chip away at when they take office after the Sept. 19 election.

Legal experts led the potential council members through the political mine field of conflict of interest, open meetings, public disclosure and Washington's unique Appearance of Fairness Doctrine.

IN SEA-TAC, three city council candidates may already have been caught in the minefield. Bob Hauth, a former official with the state Attorney General's office said that no council member who works for King County will legally be able to vote on any issues involving

negotiations between cities and the county.

Three candidates in Sea-Tac work for King County. There are no candidates in Federal Way who work for King County. Hauth, now general counsel for the Municipal Research and Services Center of Washington, said it would be a conflict of interest, although a remote one, for a council member to vote on any issue involving the company or agency from which he or she makes a living.

Hauth also raised other legal and ethical issues including whether it's unethical for a council member to have lunch bought by a developer who has a project under consideration by the city.

Some cities prohibit such payments, others do not, Hauth said.

SUCH SITUATIONS highlight the dilemma surrounding political ethics. Although some may not be illegal, they may be considered unethical by some candidates and voters,

The law does not always give clear guidance, said Steve De-Julio, a former city attorney and now a private attorney.

According to a handout on ethics distributed by DeJulio, a good rule of thumb for candidates might be, "How would it look in the newspaper headlines?"

DeJulio also instructed candidates briefly on Washington's Appearance of Fairness Doctrine. Washington is one of only two states in the country to have such a doctrine, which states

that council members must disclose all business or conducted discussions in their official capacity.

For instance, a private or exparte conversation with a developer who has a project pending with the city, must be disclosed. If not put on the record by the council member, the council's action could later

Chemical leak found at truck stop

Rob Rueber said it was a real surprise to find a hardened "icicle" of chemicals leaking from beneath a truck trailer at the Evergreen Industrial Park on Thursday.

The truckstop manager's discovery, prompted by a driver who had been sleeping in his own truck next to the leaking trailer, set off several hours of watching and waiting Thursday as hazardous materials teams tried to discern what was in the trailer. Hazardous materials teams from Fire District 39 (Federal Way) and the Port of Seattle responded to Rueber's call for help just after 9 a.m. Thursday. What they found were 600 5-

gallon containers of pyrocote, a

fire-proofing carbo-zinc, a primer used on and phenoline, used to line tanks that hold corrosive materials, said Paul O'Brien, an on-scene coordinator for the state Department of Ecology.

The chemicals are not explosive, but some are flammable.

Apparently, the chemicals had leaked between the floor boards of the truck trailer. Two or more may have mixed together to become the hard "icicle" of drippings, said Boyd Johnson, spokesman for the fire department.

The containers inside the trailer were stacked haphazardly, but investigators were not sure what had made the chemicals spill.

The 40-foot long truck trailer had a license plate and blue trim along its off-white flanks, but no cab and no logo painted on its side. No hazardous chemicals were listed on the trailer's metal skin, either, as must legally be done when such products are trucked.

The trailer probably has been parked in the lot of the truck stop for more than a month, said Rueber. As with most other truck stops, he said, vehicles are not registered to stay there.

"And sometimes there are 200 trucks or more out here," he added. "We try to keep track of who's who, but that's difficult to do."

As of Thursday afternoon, investigators had found the owner of the trailer, an Auburn resident, but not the leasee who had last used it.

O'Brien said the owner rented the trailer to someone in 1982, but since then, that person rented or gave the trailer to so-

Committee hosts state road officials

As the Federal Way First! Transition Team continues to learn about how to run a city, we hear about state and federal highway grants. But what are they, how much do they pay, what will they fund, and how do we get our hands on this money? Sounds like we needed another meeting, so last Monday I hosted a meeting of the Transportation Committee to discuss state and federal funding of road projects for the new city.

I will try to report as fully as possible what we learned, so stay awake. There may be a test. Bob Stead, Debbie Ertel, Dave Kaplan, Dick Burris, Jean Marie Brough, and I met with Don Hoffman, district state aid engineer with Washington State Dept. of Transportation (WSDOT), and John Trevis, area engineer with the State Transportation Improvement Board (TIB).

Basically, the TIB distributes state funds for large "corridor" road projects. Something running through more than one jurisdiction that will reduce congestion caused by existing or future economic development would be a likely project. The widening of 356th Street from Pacific Highway South to 21st Avenue Southwest is a TIB project. The state will pay up to 80 percent of these projects.

If a gas tax is passed, the money will go to what is left of the Urban Arterial Board (UAB). This program pays 80 percent of relatively small projects in urban areas that will produce documentable results in reducing congestion or improving safety.

Both of those programs are quite limited in funding, so projects are chosen carefully and sometimes have to wait a long time for funding. The state also has Category C funding, but we didn't discuss it.

The federal funding comes through a program called Federal Aid Urban System (FAUS) funding. These projects are selected by the Puget Sound Council of Governments (PSCOG), with applications being submitted through the State Aid office, WSDOT. These projects must be for improvement or extension of the Urban Arterial System.

336th is shown running through to join with Southwest Campus Drive at First Avenue South. We first will have to submit proper descriptions of our arterials and collector roads as now built.

What does all this mean to us now? King County, as I had mentioned recently, is applying for FAUS money for the construction phase of the 16th Avenue South project mentioned above. They will have to sign an interlocal agreement with the new city to allow them to do the project inside city limits, or possibly pass the money to Federal Way for us to do the project. If the new city does not want the project (and the money) for some reason, they just decline it, so nothing irrevocable is being done.

The county is also applying for more money for the 356th Street project, phase II. The road goes through a peat bog, a part of the Hylebos wetland, on a fill. The two new lanes probably cannot be built in the same way since environmental laws regarding wetlands are much stronger than when the road was built. The structure to support the new lanes will cost about \$2.5 million and the county is applying to the TIB for this additional money, as they are funding 80 percent of the project. Completion of this work will probably also require an interlocal agreement.

TIB project application deadline for this year is the first of September. We will not have a city by then, and cannot (in my opinion) expect the county to apply for all the projects we need. We discussed the possibility that we could apply as the transition team, and it seems likely. To this end, I am beginning to compile a list of projects suitable for this funding.

I expect to pursue this work as time permits, and perhaps complete at least a few applications. Your suggestions of projects for application would be quite helpful. Please write or call, or catch me at the Thursday 7:30 a.m. Federal Way Chamber Legislative/Transportation Committee meeting now being held at the Educational Service Center building (school district headquarters) each week.

meone else. The owner said he has no idea who left the trailer and chemicals at the truck stop.

After the neighboring truck driver alerted Rueber to the problem, the truck stop manager looked under the trailer to see the leak, then made what he called a "probably stupid" move and opened the trailer's unlocked the doors to look inside.

Johnson said that although Rueber had put himself in potential danger by looking inside the trailer, the fire department was grateful that he had written

down the names of the chemicals listed in the 5-gallon drums.

"It was fortunate for us, actually, that he was smart enough to write down what he saw,' Johnson said.

"That's good, but I'm not doing it again next time," Rueber said with a laugh.

O'Brien said the chemicals were removed by Olympus Environmental and taken to Chem-Pro, a hazardous waste disposal company in Seattle. The DOE has assumed responsibility for the cleanup because the owner cannot be found, he said. The cost of the cleanup is not known.

negotiation and Barden hopes to meet with candidates this week about the plan.

While the candidates contacted all said they are open to negotiating with the county, several said they strongly oppose continued management of Federal Way land use by the county's Building and Land Development DiVision (BALD).

Others added that the city should take control of its transportation planning functions as soon as possible.

Here's what the candidates had to say:

Position 1

Mary Gates - "It seems to me we have to take control immediately in our land and capital projects areas. I wouldn't want to put that in the hands of the county.'

Gates said she is open to negotiations with the county. Bill Shortt - "I don't want to

give up the permitting or landuse decisions. I think Paul's gutsy. He's making an effort." Position 2

Mark Freitas could not be reached for comment. Joel Marks did not return phone calls.

Position 3

Georgene "Jo" Asbury ---Asbury said she had no comment on Barden's proposal.

Debra Ertel -- "I have a lot of questions. Are they going to go ahead and do the road projects they planned if they collect taxes? I wouldn't want to contract with (BALD). They don't have the staff. I want the motion to be more specific.'

Position 4

Elaine Cook - "I'm trying to figure it out. It really doesn't say anything definite.'

Cook has spoken with Barden about the proposed ordinance. Jim Webster - "I'm pleased that Paul and the county want to do something and make it as easy as possible for the city to get under way. I'm concerned that the areas of issuing building permits...not be contracted."

Webster also said if the city does accept Barden's proposal, that the county should open a service center in Federal Way. Position 5

Jim Handmacher — "I haven't had a chance to form an opinion yet. I will discuss it with Paul.'

Bob Wood - Wood could not be reached for comment.

Position 6

John Ridley - "I'd like to work with King County, but we don't want to give away any advantages."

Bob Stead - "I wrote (Barden) and told him it would not be acceptable as long as land-use planning is contracted to the county. I don't know the reason for the \$600,000. I don't know whether that's reasonable."

Position 7

Lynn Templeton -- "I think it was a good-faith gesture, however, I won't support the measure. The community has spoken quite clearly and

delivered a mandate for independence and autonomy. Their position was (to have) local control."

Phil Watkins - "It's a starting point for negotiations, but it raised more questions than it answers. I can't imagine Federal Way will want the county to continue land-use planning. It's an improvement over the original (county proposal to recover full costs through contracting). However, there's still a tone of confrontation."

No date has been set yet for a meeting between Barden and the candidates. The county hopes to negotiate and approve contracts between Oct. 1 and Nov. 30

In his letter, Barden advises the candidates it will be difficult for the city to begin operating on its own in 1990.

The sheer magnitute of challenges facing you the first year lead me to believe that 1991 will see the first major shifts of responsibility," Barden said.

Before leaving, Klusman reportedly took the victim's money, and told her to stay still for three hours.

POLICE ARRESTED Klusman shortly after midnight the same night, after he was spotted at a restaurant near SeaTac Mall.

Det. Dave Jutilla, who investigated the Aug. 8 incident, said that Klusman is also a "person of interest" in a June 3 rape in the Maple Valley area.

In that incident, the victim said a man was waiting in her car as she left a grocery store at 6 a.m. The suspect held a knife to her throat and forced her to drive to a nearby wooded area where he sexually assaulted her.





Developers win delay in school fees

Developers have been temporarily spared from sharing in the cost of new school construction.

King County Council A measure that would have required developers to help pay school construction costs was watered down by a council committee before it was approved on Thursday.

The revised measure eliminates fees or land donations from developers who build in crowded school districts. Instead it requires the county hearing examiner to slow down a development, if the school district can show that the pro-

ject would bring in more children than the school can accommodate.

School administrators supported the measure, even though it no longer required developers to help pay for new schools

Fred High, director of finance for the Kent School District, said he was "pleased that the council is being responsive to the district's needs."

HIGH TOLD THE committee that his district "has very little optimism of keeping up with the growth" in Kent. He said the revised measure, even without the financial benefits, would help his district.

SIMS CALLED the measure a 'good compromise'' for the short-term. He insisted that his proposal to charge developers for new schools could still become a county ordinance, but he was putting it on the back burner until a citizen task force completes its report on the issue.


The task force was appointed by the council several months ago, and is due to recommend solutions to the problem of rapidly growing schools in a December report.

DEVELOPERS strongly opposed the committee bill, as well

as Sims' original proposal. Jim Williams, executive director of the Seattle Master Builders Association, told the committee that the ordinance

was unnecessary. "In many rapidly growing areas, such as Federal Way and Issaquah, we are already working with the districts to provide such things as portable classrooms," he said.

In earlier statements, Federal Way School District officials have said that the district will be able to house all its students for the next three years, but after that, the district could face a shortage of classrooms.

but it looks as though the county may ask the city to pay its share of senior center funding in proportion to the number of its citizens who use the center, Brooks said.

That would be the long-range plan, Brooks said. The transition plan is likely to be different, and may give the city some time to develop its own policy, she added.

"There's no way the Federal Way Senior Center will be left high and dry," Brooks said.

She also said she's hoping the new city council will establish a human services department that will oversee such agencies as the senior center. That's what Federal Way First! Transition Team members on the human services committee probably will recommend, said committee member Nancy McEleney.

THE COMMITTEE won't literally make a recommenda-

tion that the center be funded, McEleney said, but it will try to make the new city council aware of the need for human services.

Seniors hope for city-county pact

She believes the city will respond accordingly. "It seems to be a pretty high priority out here," she said of senior services.

Despite assurances from Brooks and others, center manager Yvonne Sullivan still worries. She's already had one fiscal scare from the county, when it recently said it would budget her program director, Alice Reed, just through December. After that, the city is expected to share responsibility, Sullivan was told.

Sullivan said the center is operating on a bare-bones budget as it is. There's just herself and two half-time employees, Reed and Eric Carson, who works with housebound seniors.

THE CENTER offers, through staff daily programs, ranging

from arts and craft classes, to meals, foot care, exercise and counseling.

Sullivan said she's hoping to maintain status quo, but she isn't counting on anything yet. She's hoping, though, to have some answers soon, so she can redirect some of her energies back into the center. She's been working with the transition team on senior issues and lobbying the county.

What's been especially frustrating is having no city officials to lobby. No city will legally exist until sometime after the Sept. 19 election.

So the seniors are doing what they can to pin down the 14 council candidates by sending out senior issues surveys and inviting them to speak at Thursday evening's forum at the center, 4016 S. 352nd St.

The questionnaire is designed to find out what candidates know about available senior services, how they feel about senior issues and how important they believe senior services are to the community.

"We want to let them know this is an important service to ballot. Roy Wood, president of the center's board of directors said he's hoping the forum will get candidates to commit to the center and other social services. The questionnaires should, "Get it all down in black and white," he said. "We've been getting some

favorable responses so far, but we'll have to wait and see. They're not elected yet, and who knows what they'll do," Wood said.

Jane Scholes, who lives inside the city limits, visits the center three times a week and was there on Wednesday for lunch and a hula presentation by Coke Yasutake of the Lei Aloha Studio in Seattle.

She said a good many seniors count on the center for a variety of needs, and members will remember those who don't support its services when they go to the polls.

"I THINK the politicians will have to come through. There'll be a lot of people who won't vote for them next time if they don't," Scholes said.

Sullivan is trying to stay optimistic.

"What I'm hoping is there will be a friendly working partnership with the city and county and we will not go without. But in reality, we know a new city has priorities and we're not going to be at the top," Sullivan said.



Durning, an attorney and former official with the federal Environmental Protection Agency, wants to create a county department of environmental quality to combat the problem.

"Bad county planning has (brought) tons of air pollutants emitted, trees cut, soils eroded, and new streams of polluted water running down to Puget Sound," he said.

UNDER DURNING'S proposal, the new department would be charged with protecting the environment from pollution, deforestation and other problems inherent with growth. Saying that he wanted to make environmental protection a top priority, Durning criticized the Hill administration for focusing on development rather than preserving "our most precious asset, our clean, green beautiful environment.'

A spokesman for Tim Hill said the county executive would not comment on Durning's proposal.

BRUCE HILYER, the other Democrat in the race, said that he shares Durning's "love of the environment," but he could not support the creation of another county agency. Hilyer called the proposal a

"mini EPA.

"The answer is to enforce realistic growth controls, not to add another bureacracy to our governmental gridlock," he said.

In the Thursday press conference, Durning also proposed phasing out the county's fleet of diesel and gasoline fueled vehicles, and replacing them with cars and trucks that burn compressed gas, ethanol or other less polluting fuels.

HIS PLAN ALSO calls for a ban on styrofoam containers, and stricter rules controlling water that runs into Puget Sound.

In addition, Durning wants the county to plant trees "from Alki Point to Snoqualmie Pass.

"Here we sit, right smack in the middle of one of the earth's major temperate forest regions, and we cut down trees like there's no tomorrow.

"By example, and by ordinance, we can and must stop the denuding of this county," he said.

A Seattle woman told King County police she was forced to smoke cocaine and have sex with two men after accepting a ride with them early Thursday morning.

She told police that the two men had attacked her in the past, but she never reported those attacks to police. She knew them as "Isaac" and "Joe" but not by their last names.

The men picked her up in a green, four-door sedan, possibly a Chrysler and forced her to smoke cocaine, she said. They made four or five stops - along the roadside, at a hotel, a Circle K store, at some brown apartments and in a wooded area in Federal Way, where she was forced to have sex with both men.

The woman said she was let out of the car and began walking, but was rejoined by one of the men 10 minutes later. The two of them walked until the car returned and she got back in. She said she was then taken to a wooded area where the men beat her and let her go.

A passerby picked her up and took her to a restaurant, where he instructed a waitress to summon help because the woman said she was in pain. She was taken to St. Francis Community Hospital.

The first attacker was described as black, about 42 years old, 210 pounds, and wearing jeans. He had a graying beard and a long, square, sunken face.

The second attacker was black, about 32 years old, and was wearing tan denim pants. He had a short, thin mustache and an unkempt Afro.

Sports Nisqually offers refuge from I-5 traffic

estern Washington is known for jagged peaks, towering evergreens and pristine wilderness.

Ironically, one of its best attractions is just seconds off Interstate 5 and 45 minutes from Sea-Tac Airport. Thousands of Washington motorists drive past it each day and never realize what they are missing.

Folks at the Nisqually National Wildlife Refuge prefer it that way.

"We deliberately don't put any signage on I-5. If everyone started pulling off, we couldn't, handle it," says refugee manager Bill Hesselbart.

But those who do take exit 114 are in for a treat.

Nature lovers can roam trails through forests and open marshes. Fishermen can cast for salmon and trout. Families can boat or canoe together. Children can wander through wildlife displays or pick three kinds of blackberries.

DON'T GET THE wrong idea, however. The refuge is not a park.

"Our main purpose is to provide as diverse a home as possible for as many different species as possible," says volunteer coordinater Lucy Anderson. Diverse is the key word.

The refuge's 3,780 acres actually contain 12 different habitats, including mud flats, freshwater marshes, salt marshes, coniferous forests and deciduous woodlands. They house more than 300 different species of wildlife.

Walk the half-mile Nisqually River Trail and you might think you are in an Olympic Mountain rain forest. Ferns, lichen and skunk-cabbage plants ring a series of small sloughs beneath towering black cottonwood and red alder trees.

Frogs, river otters and beavers find homes in the lush ground cover. Birds such as red-tailed hawks and chickadees nest in the trees.

"It's a very wet environment," says volunteer Richard Van Deman.

YET STROLL a few hundred feet away on the main-loop trial and you move through wideopen fields of thistle, interspersed with apple and pear trees.

As it winds further away from I-5, the trail follows a dike dividing freshwater and saltwater marshes. Here you can watch great blue heron fish in McAllister Creek and fly to their rookery in the trees on the other side.

You can also study the fields and try to glimpse black-tailed deer, or, if lucky, a coyote. Camouflaged photo blinds are set up at two different points to provide quiet observation spots.

In fall and winter, bald eagles visit the refuge. "I've seen as many as nine at a time," says Van Deman.

As the 5½-mile loop trail reaches its halfway point, where an observation platform is under construction, it offers views of mud flats, Puget Sound and the Tacoma Narrows Bridge.

Washington's Legislature commissioned a special report in 1970-the Ray-Alcorn Study-to investigate installing a port in this area. Its results were conclusive: a wildlife refuge and port development could not coexist.

LED BY Margaret McKenny and her Nisqually Delta Association, efforts to preserve the delta, a former farm, paid off when the U.S. Congress and Department of the Interior approved funds in 1974 to create the refuge.

Since then the Nisqually National Wildlife Refuge has drawn an increasing stream of visitors, peaking at 52,000 last year. In the future, it might have to limit public access. "We have Weyerhauser de-




